



THE PROGRESS OF THE KINGDOM

T seems not unfitting that in our July number we announce a new declaration of independence. Not as though

A New Declaration of Independence

the old one was not sufficient for American uses; but as a result of the spirit which it has devel-

oped in the American people there are, from time to time, new ones of a differ-

ent character put forth.

The latest comes from the Pacific coast, and the District of Olympia is its author. For many years this district has been under the fostering care of the Board of Missions. So rapid has been the development of the splendid coast country that it was practically impossible to keep pace with the opportunities offered to the Church. In the attempt to do so the district has had to postpone the gratification of its ambition to become a diocese. Some have asked why Olympia, with its three great cities and its comparatively small extent of territory, has not already swung into the line of American dioceses, but those who know the problems which were there being confronted know also the answer to this question. Now, however, Olympia has made its declaration of independence. Its last convention unanimously voted

to raise from various sources the necessary endowment and to apply at the coming General Convention for admission as a diocese. Bishop Keator, who was the prime mover in the matter, is to be congratulated on the statesmanlike energy with which he has handled the situation and brought about the result. Though the total amount necessary is not yet raised, those who know the district feel assured that within a few weeks it will be in hand, and already, by anticipation, we welcome Olympia among the dioceses of the American Church.

THE Treasurer's message to the Board of Missions when it met on June 14th, for its last session until next

The Critical Summer Season fall, showed an increase in butions up to June 1st of \$43,000 over

last year. Last month the increase stood at \$35,000. There has therefore been an improvement of \$8,000 during the month. Were our obligations identical with those of last year this information would be most encouraging, but since they are more than \$100,000 greater, the relative increase shown only marks the need for further improve-

The summer season is always the critical time in the missionary treasury. Parishes or individuals who have forgotten or neglected to make their gifts for missions earlier in the year are likely to keep on forgetting. Congregations are growing small and rectors consider it not worth while to announce missionary offerings, while it is too rarely the case that summer residents worshipping elsewhere than in their own churches recognize any obligation toward the missionary work of the Church. Might not readers of The Spirit of Missions who are away for the whole or a part of the summer bear in mind the critical situation of the missionary treasury, and try to bring it about that in the church where they worship a special opportunity shall be given to contribute, and that at least some portion of the amount expended in summer outings and recreation be dedicated to the furtherance of the task which our Lord has set before His Church?

Though the record of giving in most instances is better than ever before, it must, in these next three or four months, be even more improved if the Church is to show a clean balance sheet when the General Convention meets.

THE organization which was begun by the passing of the missionary canon three years ago in Richmond will

Our New be completed before the next General Convention meets in Cincinnati. The various departments

have availed themselves of the permission given in that Canon, perfected department organization and elected their several secretaries. Department II—embracing New York and New Jersey—at its meeting last fall in Syracuse, chose the Rev. John R. Harding, D.D., the rector of Trinity Church, Utica, for nomination to the Board of Missions as its Department Secretary. Unfortunately, at that time Dr. Harding felt that he could not take up the work, and his name did not come before the Board.

The Second Department has, therefore, during the past year, been the only one which had not its own secretary. So far as they could do so, the secretaries on the staff at the Missions House have tried to supply the deficiency, but in view of the admirable results being obtained in other departments, where efficient and energetic secretaries are at work, it seemed unfortunate that a more aggressive campaign could not be carried on in so important a part of the Church as that embraced in Department II.

It was therefore with pleasure that the Board heard at its last meeting the announcement that Dr. Harding had reconsidered the matter, and felt that he could now take the work proffered. He was immediately elected, and expects to assume his duties on September 1st.

It is no doubt somewhat early to draw conclusions as to the value of the Missionary Departments and the work of the department secretaries. In many instances the organization has been too recent and the term of the secretary's service too brief to justify generalization, but it ought to be said that the effect thus far upon the Church has been most stimulating, and that the work goes on with every promise of success.

WITH the September number of The Spirit of Missions a new department will be opened. Each month a

Missions in the Sunday-school few pages will be devoted to the subject of "Missions in the Sunday-school."

This department will aim to meet the needs of the Sunday-school teacher who desires to supplement regular work by a limited amount of missionary instruction.

This department will encourage correspondence with the Sunday-school leaders of the Church. Suggestions and descriptions of successful methods will be welcomed and published for the assistance of others.

This department will be edited by the Rev. William E. Gardner, Secretary of the First Department. For a number of years Mr. Gardner has been chairman of the Missions Committee of the Sunday-school Federation. He has been a close student of Sunday-school methods and will bring to this department the best that he has from his experience.

It is hoped that every Sunday-school teacher in the Church will subscribe to The Spirit of Missions and utilize this material and seek the aid of this department. A special club rate of 50 cents per annum will be established for Sunday-school teachers. Conditions governing this rate will be announced later.

With the co-operation of the rectors, superintendents and teachers, this department can be made of great value in the educational work of the Church.

EVERY Christian man must have a feeling, if not a conviction, that the cause of missions somehow makes a de-

mand upon him. At least he cannot escape a certain sense of responsibility for

informing himself about the matter. The old conditions, under which thousands of really devout Christian folk utterly ignored and perhaps altogether condemned the missionary enterprise, have passed away-we believe, forever. While the average layman is probably not today fully prepared to admit that the cause of missions is the cause of Christ, and that in such a matter there is only one place for the loyal follower of Christ to stand, yet we believe that he, more than ever before, feels a responsibility for definitely making up his mind and convincing himself as to the point of view which he ought to adopt. In other words, he really wants to know whether the missionary business is worth while, and his conscience-at least that one which he carries with him to church on Sundays—is slightly uneasy so long as he remains undecided.

How Are Men to Know? But it must be frankly recognized that not many opportunities for de-

ciding such a question with any real knowledge of the facts present themselves to the average business man. He does not give much time to reading the Church papers, he takes no missionary magazine, and whatever information he does get on the subject will probably be from the secular papers and periodicals. Perhaps his rector preaches an occasional missionary sermon, or gets someone else to do so, but the layman is probably elsewhere when the sermon is preached. How, then, is he really to settle this question except in the negative?

Of course the easiest thing is to decide offhand and without a hearing that the whole missionary propaganda is preposterous. But somehow it has linked itself in his religious consciousness with certain definite words of the Master which echo there in spite of him, and though claiming to have convinced himself that missions are anathema, he remains at bottom unconvinced. For such a man, who really wants to know—or feels that he ought to try to know—the facts, the article entitled, "Are Foreign Missions

a Failure?" which appears elsewhere in this issue, furnishes a distinct opportunity. Here are certain categorical answers to definite and fundamental questions concerning the missionary enterprise which were asked in public print by a man who "did not believe in missions." We must probably assume that they expressed his thought upon the matter, and what he thought others may be thinking. These questions are answered by a man who knows-a layman and business man to whom the reality and urgency of the missionary enterprise became so absolutely vital, that after thorough investigation he gave to it his life and fortune. He has staked these upon the accuracy and truth of his judgment. Such a man as George Sherwood Eddy, who backs his convictions with all that he has and is, deserves to be heard with consideration when he tells his story.

AS a result of many months of consideration, involving the work of two or three different committees, the

A Policy on Specials Board at its May meeting adopted certain regulations concerning appeals

for special gifts, the substance of which was that missionaries, either domestic or foreign, whose salaries are in whole or in part paid by appropriations of the Board, "shall not make any general appeal for special gifts without having first obtained the permission of the Bishop and the Board, in consultation with whom all such special funds secured shall be expended."

This action was taken, not with the purpose of discouraging "specials," but because it was felt that the interest of all parties concerned would be better safeguarded by the adoption of some settled policy. While it may seem to prevent individual initiative on the part of the missionaries, it does so only to the extent of bringing in the other two parties who have a real interest in the matter, and in case of agreement securing to the enterprise their backing and

co-operation. So far from limiting the individual initiative of donors, this policy is intended to operate as a guarantee and protection for their gifts; while so far as the Board of Missions is concerned it will thus have knowledge of enterprises that are under way, and be better able to avoid duplication of appeals and unfair distribution of the Church's bounty.

E VEN those who were closely associated with and earnest supporters of the Laymen's Missionary Movement

felt anxiety about its future. It was freely prophesied in many quarters that

this would prove to be only another of those passing enthusiasms which so readily lay hold upon the imagination of crowds and carry them with it for a time, only to leave them, when it evaporates, somewhat more dry and callous than it found them.

This danger was freely recognized by the leaders of the Movement. This was the reason for the restraint—one might almost say the discouragement—of mere enthusiasm, which was so marked a feature in the conduct of the meetings. The leaders tried throughout to deal with, and to have every one else deal with, the fundamental realities of the question. Practical, definite information was furnished, and a business-like method of applying the power generated was carefully outlined.

Not only is this true, but the programme for next year, which has just been announced, is wisely devised to conserve and follow up the interest already aroused. Conventions will be held in only a limited number of large cities not already touched. Smaller places will be visited by groups of men whose object will be not so much the holding of

public meetings as the conducting of leaders' conferences, with a view to developing men who may handle county conventions successfully, and so increase indefinitely the number of places where the impetus of the movement shall be felt.

This policy is framed with a view to the dissemination of real missionary information and the development of practical efficiency in missionary service, and, if faithfully carried out, ought to make it impossible for the splendid enthusiasm thus far generated by the Movement to be dissipated or to become non-effective.

Some time ago the day's mail brought a one dollar bill to the Church Missions House, accompanied by this note:

A Midshipman's Dollar Bill

"The first money received from the Government by a

midshipman in the navy. Please apply to foreign missions and credit to New Hampshire."

There was nothing to identify the sender. Simple as the incident might seem to be at first sight, it is abundantly suggestive. Here is a young man making an offering for the extension of Christ's Kingdom from the first money he has earned in his profession. He has made a good beginning. Behind that beginning it is not difficult to see the home training of which this act is a natural expression. It is quite possible that the love for the Kingdom and the zeal for its extension, first given at home, may have been trained and deepened by study and work on behalf of missions at New Hampshire's great Church school, St. Paul's, Concord. Here, as not a few missionaries can testify, they have been warmly welcomed by the students and generously helped in their work.

And the gift is for foreign missions. The young man is no less a faithful servant of his country and its people because he wishes to share in providing for the moral and spiritual needs of distant

people. We have heard of bishops of this American Church who have laid down the proposition—we do not dare to characterize it—that the Church ought to abandon the foreign field, turn her work there over to the English Church societies, if they would take it, and confine her missionary work to the limits of the United States.

The Nation Must Be Fully Represented Abroad Not so this young naval officer. As a man in the service of the nation he, perhaps, recognizes that the relations of

this Christian land to the non-Christian people of the East must not be confined to diplomacy and trade, as some contend. If our ambassadors and consuls are to be sent to them, if our merchants are to establish branch houses in eastern cities, or otherwise carry on trade in distant markets, if our naval vessels are to visit eastern waters and their officers to pay their respects to the rulers and naval authorities of other lands, so, too, the nation must be represented abroad by those who go to teach the Christian Gospel, through chapel, school and hospital. Indeed, this last must be done whether the others are done or not, because the teaching of these missionary representatives has to do with the fundamental facts and necessities of human life, while trade, diplomacy and war are simply the things of a day.

Whether or not this young Churchman has had opportunity to see the work of foreign missions at first hand, we do not know; but when he does, his devotion will doubtless be made all the deeper; his conviction of the void in non-Christian life and of the sufficiency of the Christian Gospel to fill it, all the stronger. Some day he may return from the Far East to bear his testimony, as an eye witness, to the necessity and success of Christian missions, as such Churchmen and naval officers as Admiral Alfred T. Mahan and Admiral Charles H. Stock-

ton have already done.

ARE MISSIONS A FAILURE?

By George Sherwood Eddy

The interest aroused by the Laymen's Missionary Movement has focussed attention in an unusual way on the foreign missionary enterprise. This has naturally resulted in bringing out expressions hostile as well as friendly. A few magazines and newspapers have published critical or condemnatory articles. As an answer to all such, we reprint this article, which appeared in "World's Events," a monthly paper published in Chicago. More effective than any words which could be written by a representative of the mission boards are these statements of a man who holds no office, draws no salary, but has invested his life in the great campaign, and speaks concerning that which he has seen.



HAVE been asked by the editor of World's Events to answer certain specific questions relative to misapprehensions or recent mis-statements with regard to the foreign missionary enterprise. I am a layman and business man and speak from that point of view. I have been working at my own expense in India, as a missionary, for thirteen years. I have received no salary during that time and have devoted one-half of my income to paying my household and travelling expenses and the other half to the mission work itself. My work among the students of the Orient has taken me throughout the colleges and mission stations of

India, Burma and Ceylon, as well as to China and Japan in the Far East, and to Egypt and Palestine in the Levant. I have thus had an opportunity from a somewhat disinterested point of view to gain a wide survey of the work of missions and a general estimate of their results. I will try to answer as briefly as possible the questions of the editor, which follow:

1. Is it true that "it takes a dollar to send a dollar" or that "only one dollar in twelve actually touches the spot"? Are mission funds administered in an unbusinesslike fashion?

The actual cost of administration of most mission boards varies from 3 to 12 per cent., including women's boards. One is as low as 3¾ per cent.; two of the largest and most efficient boards have reduced the cost of administration to 5 and 6 cents on the dollar. Thus, of every dollar given to missions, from 90 to 95 cents actually goes into the work. The remaining 5 or 10 cents is spent in efficient administration and in the cultivation of the field and its base of supplies by a system of education which develops increased giving as well as efficiency. How many of our large business concerns can reduce the cost of administration to less than 5 or 10 per cent.? These mission boards have on them business men and able financiers; their accounts are audited, their expenditures scrutinized and their methods improved by the best talent of leading business men.

And how is the more than 90 per cent. that reaches the field expended? In the field where I am working, \$3 a month will support a native teacher; \$12 a year will educate a boy in boarding-school; \$20 builds a school or church, and \$30 to \$50 supports a native worker for a year. Four years' education of a boy in an expensive college in this country would cost, perhaps, \$4,000. That sum will run an entire college in the East for a year, with, perhaps, several hundred native Chris-

tian students and as many non-Christians-a college which is a centre of light and influence in a large district numbering several million inhabitants, and which is a mighty force for the uplift of the community. The accounts of every missionary on the field are strictly audited, and the expenditures of each mission are submitted to the home boards, where they can be inspected by any business man. For my own mission station last year, for instance, the board appropriated about \$1,300. With this sum I was expected to pay 30 native workers, to run 1 boarding-school, 15 dayschools, 30 congregations struggling toward self-support, and to carry on evangelistic work among 150,000 non-Christians. A little calculation will show how much room there was for "missionary waste" or extravagance upon such a budget. I know of few missionaries to-day who are receiving enough money from their boards to carry on their work.

2. In the hundred years of modern missions, have the results been as great and as gratifying as the Church had a right to expect? What are these results?

A few facts may indicate in part some of the results achieved:

A hundred years ago there were less than 100 missionaries in the field; to-day there are about 22,000. A century ago the Bible was translated into only sixty-five languages; within the century it has been translated into over 500 languages and made accessible to more than 800,000,000 of the human race, with its mighty moral and educational uplift. A hundred years ago there were no medical missionaries and more than two-thirds of the world was without any adequate medical knowledge; to-day there are several hundred medical missionaries treating annually over 3,000,000 patients. A century ago there was a little handful of mission schools; today there are more than 29,000 mission schools and colleges, educating a million and a half students and pupils in the great strategic centres of the Orient. A hundred years ago a few thousand dollars were given annually to foreign missions; to-day, missionary contributions amount to about \$25,000,000 annually, while about \$5,000,000 is given by foreign converts.*

It took nearly a century to win the first million Protestant Christians; the second million were won within twelve years; it is taking less than six years to win the third million. During 1909, on foreign mission fields, we gained 2,600 communicants every week and over 10,000 Christian adherents, or a total of 581,000 new adherents. There are to-day in the world 4,866,661 Protestant Christian adherents on mission fields. Sixty years ago there was not a professing Protestant Christian in Japan, not one in Korea, less than fifty in the Chinese Empire and a few thousands in India. To-day there is a Protestant community of 70,000 adherents in Japan, 200,000 in Korea, nearly half a million in China, and a million souls in India. India, with one possible exception, is the hardest mission field in the world, but even India is becoming, slowly but surely, Christian. The government census tells the tale. During the last ten years, while the population increased 21/2 per cent., Protestant native Christians increased more than 621/2 per cent. While the Hindus lost a fraction of 1 per cent., and while the Parsees gained 4 per cent., the Jews 6 per cent., the Mohammedans 8 per cent., Protestant Indian Christians increased more than 621/2 per cent. In China the Protestant community has increased about 100 per cent. every seven years. The Boxer uprising tried to wipe out Christianity, but the Church has gained more converts in the eight years since the Boxer uprising than in the first eighty years of missions in China. In Korea, a nation is being

"born in a day." Twenty-five years ago there was not a Christian in the country. Twenty years ago, seven men met behind closed doors to take the communion of the Lord's Supper. To-day, with over 200,000 Protestant adherents, they have gained an average of one convert an hour, night and day, during the twenty-five years that the missionaries have been in Korea. Increasing now at the rate of about 33 per cent. a year, if the present rate of increase should continue, Korea would be a Christian country within thirty years, to be followed later by the Philippines, Japan, China and India. Sixty years ago in the islands of the South Sea, young girls were fed and fattened like cattle to be eaten by cannibals. To-day, they have their schools and colleges, their hospitals and institutions, and are advancing in a moral, Christian civilization. As Charles Darwin wrote, "The march of improvement consequent on the introduction of Christianity throughout the South Sea, probably stands by itself in the records of history." If space permitted, pages could be given to describing transformed communities that I have seen in India and other lands.

3. Is it true that the converts are "rice Christians" and that Christianity has had "absolutely nothing to do with the moral and intellectual development of Japan"-of China, Korea and India?

As for "rice Christians," every convert that has come out within my memory, in my own station, has been persecuted by his caste, even where he came from the lowest class. There are 50,000,000 outcasts at the doors of the church in India who have been ground into dust, counted lower than the dogs, "as the filth of the world and the offscouring of all things." Before Christianity came, they could not afford to eat rice; their only meat, in some sections of India, was the carrion, or dead cattle that died of disease; they were not allowed to hold land, to get an education or to enter the temples of Hinduism. In India we have never, within my knowledge, given a penny nor any worldly help to induce any man to become a Christian. It is true that the Christians are living generally upon a higher plane than the heathen about them, but they get no "rice" save what they earn by hard work or as the result of their education. By Christian education whole communities are being uplifted

socially and physically.

Christianity has had much to do with the moral and intellectual development of India, China, Japan and other lands. The present unrest in India is chiefly the result of Western education and the conflict of the new Christian civilization with the old. Outside the Christian Church and largely as the direct or indirect result of Christian missions there is in India to-day a new ideal of life. The changeless life of contemplation is giving place to an ideal of progress, activity, self-realization and self-government. A new patriotism and a new national consciousness are sweeping over the people. There is a new demand for reform; concubinage, polygamy, the Nautch and other abuses are being condemned. Suttee, or the burning of widows, has been abolished, the murderous Thugs suppressed, infanticide prohibited, human sacrifices forbidden, obscenity in religion condemned. The age of actual marriage, which was formerly ten years, has been raised; there is a new attitude toward woman, a new condemnation of caste, and a hundred reforms, led both by Christians and Hindus, as the result of Christian missions. As Lord Lawrence, India's great viceroy, said, "Notwithstanding all that the English have done to benefit that country, the missionaries have done more than all other agencies combined." Before me as I write are the words of Lord Napier, the Earl of Northbrook, Sir Charles Aitchison, Sir Bartle Frere, Sir Mackworth Young and a long line of the rulers of India, not to mention the writings of Indian editors and educated Hindus, who could be quoted.

In China, also, there is a new passion for reform. The prohibition of footbinding, the abolition of the opium traffic, the sentiment against slavery and polygamy, and other reforms, were all begun by Christian teaching and agitation. In Japan, Christianity has spread chiefly among the Samurai and upper classes. Christians occupy by far a larger percentage, in proportion to their numbers, of positions in the legislative assemblies and government posts than members of any other religion. I have before me quotations from addresses of leading Japanese statesmen as to the influence of Christianity upon Japan and as to the need and value of the Christian religion in that land. Three thousand foreigners have been laboring for more than forty years in Japan for her welfare; a large percentage of them have been Christian men with Christian ideals who have achieved Christian results, not only in direct conversions, but in shaping the ideals and leavening the life of the nation. Christians are among the leading patriots of Japan and I could fill the entire issue of this magazine with stories of converts whom I have personally known from the higher classes in India, China and Japan. The editor of a Japan daily writes: "Looking over Japan, our 40,000,000 have a higher standard of morality than they have ever known, and when we inquire the cause of this great moral advance, we can find it in nothing less than the religion of Jesus." Marquis Ito wrote: "Japan's progress and development are chiefly due to the influence of missionaries exerted in right directions when Japan was studying the outer world." Count Okuma, former prime minister, says: "The efforts which Christians are making to supply to the country a high standard of conduct are welcomed by all right-thinking people. . . . The noble life which it (the Bible) holds up to admiration is something that will never be out of date, however much the world may progress. Live and preach this life and you will supply to the nation just what it needs at this juncture."

4. Is it true that missionary effort to-day is merely a side line to business? Do "foreign missions seem now to be based on business rather than Christianity"?

It is, emphatically, untrue. I have pointed out in several conventions of the Laymen's Movement that our foreign trade was inevitably increased by foreign missions, and that in an amount far in excess of the entire cost of foreign missions. But it has always been stated that any gain in trade was a mere by-product of the enterprise. The real result which we have sought and obtained has been in changed character and in the education of the nations. It is true that our trade with China is nearly fifty millions of dollars, with India over seventy millions, and with Japan nearly one hundred millions annually.* A considerable proportion of this trade has been developed by Christian missions. This has been inevitable, but it was not the motive or main result of the enterprise. It is with no thought of selfish commercial gain that business men in America are contributing to missions to-day. The single motive of their benevolence is Christian philanthropy. But though those who give, and those who go as missionaries, have sought no gain, the fact remains that the nation has gained commercially as the indirect result of their altruistic sacrifice. As Hon. T. R. Jernegan, Consul-General of the United States at Shanghai, said, "Missionary work has accomplished advantages to trade which the present awakening of China will soon evidence to be of great practical value. . . . The ensign of commerce follows close in the wake of the banner of the Cross, and he that would strike down the hand that carries the latter injures the interests of the former." Colonel Charles Denby, for thirteen years United States Minister to China, wrote: "The manufacturing and commercial interests in the United States, even though indifferent or directly hostile to the direct pur-

pose of the missionary enterprise, could well afford to bear the entire cost of all American missionary effort in China for the sake of the large increase in trade which results from such effort."


5. What is the Laymen's Movement? What is its basis of appeal? Is it fooling all these business men, or is their endorsement so generally given an indication that it is sound?

The Laymen's Movement, organized about four years ago in this country, represents the spontaneous effort of the Christian business men of the country to give the blessings of the Christian Gospel and of Christian civilization to the world in our day. All over the country business men are using their business talents in the administration of the great missionary enterprise. It does not profess to believe that all the world will be converted in one day, but it holds the conviction that it is our duty to share with our fellow-men the blessings that we have received from our Christian civilization, and to give every man a chance. It is meeting with unprecedented success. The laymen are not being fooled, for they are conducting the movement themselves. They are giving their own money, their own time and energy to the solution of the great problem of the world's need. It is Christian, it is humanitarian, it is businesslike, and it is succeeding.

6. Are foreign missions "a mania for saving worlds which belongs to the Middle Ages"?

Let us clearly recognize the basis and authority for this great enterprise. It is not the dream of a few modern optimists, but the central command of Christ's message. All human advancement depends upon passing on the blessings that we have received. Almost every advantage that we possess, as Benjamin Kidd has pointed out, is the result of our Christian civilization—our liberty, our free institutions, our education, our moral attainments, all are surely the result of the Christian civilization that we received from the East, brought to us through foreign missions. If the men who sacrificed their lives, and those who gave of their substance to send the Christian Gospel to our savage ancestors in Europe had not believed in foreign missions, where would we be to-day? We may believe in missions, or we may not, but if we choose to be against the missionary movement, let us realize at least what we are doing; let us recognize Whom it is we are opposing and Whose authority we challenge; let us admit that we begrudge the blessings that we have received to those of the other half of the human race who are still in darkness.

Half the world to-day has not heard of Christ. Broadly speaking, that is the half that is ignorant; for half our fellow-men to-day cannot read or write in any language; and they are without any adequate medical knowledge. Half the world is poor. We have what they need; they lack just that which has uplifted us. It is estimated that to give a chance to every man in the world, to furnish the number of missionaries that would be needed to adequately give the Christian message to the other half of the world, would cost but 5 cents a week from every Christian. It is true that we have needs at home, but we have men enough and money enough for both. As with the individual, no nation liveth to itself alone. We shall save America by saving the world. We shall be blessed in giving; we shall grow strong with generous impulses, with strenuous endeavor, with noble sacrifice. We believe in missions because we believe in God. Naturally, one who does not believe in the Founder of missions will not believe in their results. If Christ is nothing to us, we will believe Him to be superfluous to other men. What He is to us, we will want Him to be to the world. If we fairly interpret missions in the spirit of their Founder, in their purpose, in their methods and results, we will, I think, agree that missions are not a failure.

OREGON AND ITS PROBLEM

If you were an Easterner visiting for the first time the Middle West, and should hear some resident of that section tell you that he was going to "The Coast," you would doubtless picture him as appearing shortly in Boston or New York. But beyond the Mississippi there is only one "Coast," and it is not on the Atlantic. "The Coast" means Oregon, Washington or California. Toward that coast thousands of eyes are looking and thousands of feet are marching—an increasing army, year by year. Those who a decade ago went to what was then the West, in search of home and fortune, are now seeking a farther West; and though they may tarry in their journey, for many of them the march will not be finally stopped except by the waves of the Pacific.

Here, then, is one of the Church's problems which our bishops in those far western states must face and solve. It is with this thought in his heart

that Bishop Scadding of Oregon writes:

ECENTLY I made an extended visitation of the missions in the coast counties southern Oregon. The country is difficult of access, for no railway has yet been built across the coast range of mountains, and travelling must be done by stage over winding trails, or along the beach at low tide, or by boat on the many beautiful rivers. Although called a "diocese," Oregon is practically nothing more than a vast missionary district, twice the size of the Diocese of Ohio. It is both undermanned and under-equipped for the problems before the Church. Thousands of homeseekers are settling in southern Oregon. They are stalwart, sturdy citizens—not the element which forms the "tenement problem" of large Eastern cities, but a worthy agricultural and commercial element. They need the preaching of the Gospel and pastoral care quite as much as American residents in the foreign fields. In my judgment, this can best be done at present on the scriptural and apostolic plan of an associate mission.

This plan, as it is being carried on out here, has for its object the development of the spiritual life of the clergy by united prayer and study; encouragement and cheer by association in work; economy with efficiency of service in the field by encouraging self-help and rousing the people to feel their own responsibility, which is in the end the assurance of growth and development.

I often speak of my mission clergy as a "flying squadron." Last summer they were sent into the coast counties under Archdeacon Horsfall to minister to the many missions where services had been carried on only intermittently, resulting in loss of children to the Church and prestige in the community. The Rev. F. B. Bartlett began at the California line and worked north, visiting every rancher in any way connected with the Church, and holding services wherever groups could be gathered. The Rev. H. R. Talbot and two young laymen went in by stage from Drain, and ministered to the missions on their way south. They met at Ban-



don, and were joined by Archdeacon Horsfall and a theological student from the General Seminary. They lived in my bungalow on Bandon Beach, and did their own cooking and housekeeping. From this associate mission centre they conducted regular services Sundays and week-days at Bandon, Coquille, Empire, Gardiner, Marshfield, North Bend, and at "St. Peter's-in-the-Rock," an improvised chapel in a large cave on the shore about two miles from Bandon, and close to the bungalow. An early celebration of the Holy Communion was held here on Thursday and Sunday mornings, and at one time ten were present. Later in the season, ac-

companied by Mrs. Scadding, I came down by steamer, and we took up our headquarters in the bungalow, and the work of the clergy was followed up by the bishop's official visitation for confirmations.

The bungalow, which I expect to make headquarters for missionary work every summer, is a small cabin built of rough lumber, containing a large, open fireplace, with three small rooms built around it. The furniture is strong and serviceable and was nearly all made by the clergy and the young laymen with them. The site is one of the most picturesque in Oregon. The cabin is built half-way down the cliff, and is about fifty feet from the sea at high tide. In front is a hard sand beach, and on either side large and beautiful rocks reach far out to sea. This is a beautiful as well as strategic point for a "prophet's chamber."

Fifty miles north, reached only by stage driving on the beach at low tide, is St. Mary's Church, Gardiner, which has service only three times a year. But the loyal and faithful communicants have not lost heart, and have just built an attractive church upon the hill. The estimate was \$800, but, alas! it cost \$1,000. The parishioners raised the estimated cost, and the bishop has prom-

ised to try to raise dollar for dollar if they will pay off the balance. This they are undertaking with zeal, for they are happy in the thought that through the help of the associate mission clergy, Archdeacon Horsfall can arrange many more services.

The policy in Oregon is not to see

how widely funds can be scattered, or how many men can be appointed, but rather to put men who know how to bring things to pass, in fields where something can be brought to pass. It is estimated that under the associate mission plan \$25 will keep a mission station open one month.

A CHINESE LAYMEN'S MISSIONARY MOVEMENT

By Bishop Graves

A BOUT four years ago a society known as the Men's Auxiliary was organized in the District of Shanghai. Its object is to bind the laymen in all our various stations together, to raise money for Church work and to rouse the men to do work for the Church among non-Christian Chinese. Interest in the enterprise has gradually grown, and one station after another has established branches. At the present time every station has a branch except Yangchow, where there are not as yet Christians enough to constitute one.

The Chinese laymen have year by year shown greater capacity for conducting the affairs of the society. It is very much their own, for by the Constitution the foreign missionaries are not eligible to hold office in it. Up to this year I have myself presided at the meetings in order to insure that the society should have every encouragement and also start on reasonable lines. Last year the ability of the members to manage their own affairs without any help beyond occasional advice from the foreigners was quite evident, so I wrote to the committee suggesting that at the meeting this year their own president should preside and the business be entirely in their hands. This plan was followed at the and meeting recently held, abundantly successful.

There was a service of Holy Communion in the morning. The preacher was the Reverend C. C. Li, of St.

The church was well Peter's, Sinza. filled, and there were 120 communi-The business session began at cants. two o'clock in the afternoon. By invitation I opened it with prayer and a short address of welcome. It was most interesting after that to see how the business was conducted. Dr. Eli Day, of St. Luke's Hospital, was in the chair. The treasurer reported that they had on hand \$680 from the collections of last year and this year. This money they proposed to use to start a new station with a catechist from our school. secretary reported that there are now thirteen branches at the various stations and that there were 142 representatives present. Short reports were made by the secretaries of the various branches, and then followed a discussion as to the location of the proposed new station. Changchow-a large and important city on the Shanghai-Nanking Railwaywas finally decided upon.

Throughout the business was conducted with as much smoothness and as careful regard for parliamentary procedure as in any such assembly in the United States. The actual results achieved in the way of raising money and of conducting work at the different stations are, considering the size of the Church here, by no means inconsiderable, but it is in the promise of the ability to manage business on a large scale and to do it in a business-like way that the chief interest of the experiment

consists.

LIGHTS AND SHADOWS IN MEXICO

This private letter to a personal friend was not written for publication, but it contains matter so interesting and vivid that the Editor has requested permission to print it.

OR a long time I have been wishing for a clear moment in which to write to you, but somehow I continue to poke along like a sandwich man between the things I want to do and the things I ought to do but have not. However, I'm going to follow for a few minutes the suggestion of the front placard and try to forget for the time the pressing announcement of the one behind; for I want to tell you of many things about the work, some of which are making me happy and some of which are keeping me very humble. Altogether, however, as I look back over my extended trips among the congregations-each with its own little hopes, plans and problems—the field looks brighter than ever before, notwithstanding the great dark spot of suffering from famine (which still continues) in the midland mountain districts. However, with the generous supply of corn and blankets furnished by the "home folks," and from our American congregations here, we have been able to take off the mortal edge of suffering from thousands

of helpless beings, and are doing so still. And with the help rendered there has come the blessed sense of gratitude that the Church, by its presence and spiritual ministry to a few, has had the opportunity to help so many. Distribution is still being made from four points at the rate of a pint of corn a day for each person. There is no fruit in the country (except that of the wild cactus, the tuna, which comes in August) and the only green thing to eat is the leaf of the cactusboiled. But the rains will come in June and the garden stuff will follow in a few weeks; and the annual corn harvest will (D. V.) come in November and December.

But I am trying to get nearer to the root of the evil. Extreme poverty is chronic. The foothold on life is too uncertain. To give some of the destitute girls and women-mostly widows with children—a chance for a little self-help, I am establishing at Nopala, Hidalgo, a House of Industry. I have rented a commodious house (at .\$5 a month), which I shall furnish with sewing machines. With these and a stock of material (which I can get at nearly cost at an English mill here), the women will be taught to make cheap garments for the market, and so earn a few centavos for themselves. I have already three sewing machines in place and hope to have seventeen more by fall. I had hoped I might use the little amount given for relief for the purchase of more sewing machines, but Mr. Salinas writes me that the distress is driving the people in from great distances, some coming over a hundred miles, that he cannot send them away empty, and will soon need more corn if he is to relieve these growing crowds of far-off people. I shall, therefore, use what money remains-something over \$200—for more corn.

But over against this dark spot of suf-

fering there are many bright ones. During my last visit to the native field I laid three church corner-stones, and in seven communities I found the people building churches. In most instances the people are providing all the material and doing all the work—the women and children carrying the rock and the men doing the construction work. In one instance (at San Pedro Martir) the men have rented a parcel of ground which they are working in common, the harvest to provide the means with which to enlarge the church—and build a dome!

I must tell you of a pleasing experience I had on my last visit to this place. On my approach to the village the bells of the Roman Catholic church were ringing vigorously. My Indian attendant (they always come to the next town to escort me in) said, "The bells are ringing to welcome the bishop." "Is their bishop coming also?" I asked. "No," was the reply, "it is because our bishop is coming." And so it was. And it pleased me to know that there was such peace and good-will in the village.

This reminds me of another pleasant happening. When I dropped off the train at Vicente, seven miles from Xochitenco-a village where the people earn a living by fishing for flies, which are both eaten and sold for birdfood-on Lake Texcoco, I looked for the saddle horses but there were none; only a fine coach and spick driver, so I started off on foot. Soon, however, the coach overtook me, and the driver asked if I were not the bishop. "Yes," I said, "but I am not the Roman bishop." "No, no," he said, "you are the American bishop. I am sent for you." I was puzzled, for I knew that none of our people could afford a coach. When I got to the little church I learned that the chief lady of the town, a very devout Roman Catholic had sent to bring me in, knowing very well who and what I was. In the evening the coach came to return me to the station.

At these places we are not known as "Protestants," a hated name in Mexico;

but as "Catholics - American, not Roman." To give you an idea of the degree of infamy that attaches to the term "Protestant" in the minds of our own people here. I must refer to another dark spot, though a very small one. A few weeks ago while in Guadalajara I was told of the shameful persecution which three maiden ladies belonging to the higher class, members of our congregation, had suffered at the hands of Roman Catholics. The Rev. William Watson, in charge of our native work in Guadalajara, took me to call on these three sisters. The eldest showed me how all the windows had been broken out by stones: that it was impossible to retain a servant: and that the produce from their gardens, the source of their support, was boycotted. "But," she said, "I went to complain to the bishop, and when at last they admitted me, I told him how we had been treated by his peo-Then one of the priests standing near said, 'This woman, your worship, is a Protestant." "Me!" she cried, "Me he called a Protestant! O my God! That was the worst of all-to be called a Protestant!" Then, after hiding her tears with her hands for a moment, she raised her right hand and said, "But I called God to witness that I am no Protestant, but as good a Catholic as they, though not of Rome."

It is difficult to realize the ignominy attached to the word Protestant in Mexico. The popular conception of its meaning is an infidel who is in league with Satan-the enemy of Christ and His Church. However we may cherish the name for its historic meaning, the moral propriety of identifying the native of this country with it under its popular meaning, and with the consequent hatred and persecution it engenders, is a subject for serious consideration. For Mexico, at least, the name Protestant should, I am persuaded, be eliminated from the title page of the Spanish version of the Book of Common Prayer. For forty years these native Church people have repudiated it,

declaring themselves "Catholic, but not Roman; Evangelical, but not Protestant." Now, by canon law, they must use the Book of Common Prayer, which declares by its title that it and they are "Protestant!" It is hardly fair.

Marked advances have been made along all lines the past year, as shown by our statistics. The women of our Auxiliary have come into helpful, cooperative touch with our native women in many places, organizing them and

teaching them how to do things that help. And the earnest zeal with which the native women have responded is most encouraging. Mrs. Aves has made many visits with me in the native field, where the saddle work is least, giving instructions, organizing them, and planning definite work. Good fruit will come from this.


In the English-speaking field we are also moving ahead. The new church and parish house at Chihuahua, with a fine east window in memory of the late Rev. Henry Forrester, have been completed—though there is still a small debt. Land and a small sum of money have been given at San Luis Potosi. At Guadalajara a good piece of property has been donated for a church. Here also land has been given for a Church hospital and sanitarium, and the foreign colony

is interested. Until we can secure sufficient funds with which to build, we are starting the work in a rented building. At Christ Church, Mexico City, a fine parish house is building. And in many places the church furniture has been improved. But, best of all, a fine spirit prevails.

A great want that lies close to my heart, because close to the vital welfare of the poorest of our people, is that of a medical missionary. If disease and ignorance, and a poverty that absolutely prohibits the employment of a doctor, is a criterion of such a need, then it is difficult to imagine a people anywhere more deserving of the other of the twin ministries of the Good Shepherd-Physician, or more nearly identified with "the least" of His brethren. Our missionaries do what they can, but how little at best! In some communities where I visit, either typhus, typhoid, small-pox, or scarlet fever is always present to run its course unchecked. During a recent visit to Hidalgo (Mrs. Aves was with me) while Mr. Salinas, the other missionary and I were in the field, an old woman who had fallen and broken her arm came to the mission house to have it set. As we were to be gone three days. Mrs. Salinas and Mrs. Aves set the bone—as well as it will ever be set. Mr. Salinas is neither physician nor surgeon, but much of his time while at home is occupied with the ailments of the people who come to him for treatment and drugs. The nearest doctor is sixteen miles away, and he charges thirty pesos (\$15 United States currency) a visit, which means that these poor Indians, who earn twenty-five centavos (twelve and one-half cents) a day, are not among his patients.

Deaconess Affleck has just written me of her visit to Nopala, and speaks of the sick children and women who came to her while she was there. "I can't," she says, "get those people off my mind, and long to help them. How we do need a medical mission up there!" Yes, we

must have it!

"THEY THAT GO DOWN TO THE SEA IN SHIPS"

HERE are no American seamen!" Such is the burden of many an article in the popular press; but when I turn to the official statistics of the Bureau of Navigation I find that there are American seamen—over 180,000 of them—serving in American ships alone.

What is the Church doing for them? And what for those tens of thousands of seamen of other nationalities who constantly throng our seaports? Those of our readers who reside in New York, Boston or Philadelphia know the splendid work being done there by our Church—know how in spite of many difficulties

Chaplain Mansfield in New York banks nearly \$250,000 a year of sailors' earnings, an eloquent testimony as to the immense number of men who attend his institutes.

Those who reside on the Pacific Coast know how this work among seamen was first started in 1893 by the generous aid of the Church of England "Missions to Seamen" Society, which has in seventeen years sent out eleven English clergy and \$52,000 hard cash to the bishops of the Eighth Department to enable them to cope with this great problem. Our Church is under a deep obligation to this venerable British society for its




INTERIOR OF SAN FRANCISCO SEAMEN'S INSTITUTE

munificence—unexampled since we became a separate nation and an independent Church.

Do you know what it feels like to "come in from the sea"? You have been at sea five months, let us say from New

York to San Francisco around the Horn; you have known what it was to have everything flooded in the "foc's'le," fourteen days, perhaps, without a dry moment; the tedium of always seeing the same faces and hearing the same voices, the unchanging circle of sea and sky, the absence of literature and the general air of boredom. But at last you "tie up" alongside the wharf; a few dollars are in your pocket, the whole city before you! Yes; but not a door open to you except the door of the saloon or the houses on the "Barbary Coast." But stay! There is one other door open; flanked by six saloons, with thirtyfour saloons in the opposite block, stands the Seamen's Church Institute—a diocesan property worth \$70,000, erected since the great disaster of 1906.


Let us enter; it is typical of the others in other ports. The main hall will seat 350 men, and is supplied with newspapers in eight languages, games, billiards and music. There is a writing desk with the injunction to "Write home, and do it now!" paper, envelopes, pen and ink being provided. The assistant manager receives and sends out about 7,000 such letters a year; he has banked \$45,000 of sailor's pay since the earthquake; he gives any man who wants it as much reading matter as he can carry to his ship. Our baggage room is crowded with sailor's chests and bags, our bedrooms well patronized, but above all, our record of attendance at Church is most encouraging, over 8,000 men having attended during the past year.

The Institute is as free as a saloon, without any restraints, but with a good moral and spiritual tone. Concerts and stereopticon lectures are given regularly by uptown friends, the hospitals regularly visited by the staff, and incoming deep-water ships met.

The Church has flourishing institutes at San Francisco, Port Costa, Tacoma and Honolulu-all in the Eighth De-

partment-but we want to see these institutes in every port. On the Pacific Coast several new ports are opening up. and the Church is alive to its responsibilities, but before another step forward is taken we must have a closer organization between existing institutes. For this reason the General Convention of 1907 recognized the Church's obligation in this respect and founded the Seamen's Church Institute of America, to unite all those institutes at present existing, and to provide that all future work in this connection be undertaken under the guidance of the Board of Missions.

The great, vital necessity at present is for an organizing secretary. Other Christians are busy in this matter, and it behooves the Church to bestir herself. We want \$2,000 a year for five years to enable us to put a secretary in the field who shall visit every port in the States and stir up Church people to dotheir duty. We say that "the men don't come to Church," but the history of the Seamen's Church Institutes has shown that men do come to Church, if the Church first goes out and seeks the men.

WHY MORE FOREIGN MISSIONARIES FOR JAPAN?

HE Japan mission needs more ordained men and needs them at once. On this point all who are acquainted with the present situation, both Japanese and foreigners, are agreed. Even those who some years ago were inclined to doubt the wisdom of sending out more missionaries are now earnestly pleading for an increased supply of foreign helpers. This does not indicate a step backward, or any lessening of the spirit of independence on the part of Japanese Christians, but only a deeper appreciation of the magnitude of the task before us, and a realization born of experience that, even in what may be called the second stage of the work of building up the Church in Japan, the foreign missionary's aid is not only valuable but essential.

The reason why ordained men from abroad are needed in Japan is twofold: First, the work for which a foreigner is peculiarly qualified is not yet completed; Second, the supply of Japanese ordained men is insufficient to maintain even the work in which they are more

efficient than foreigners.

Despite the many disadvantages under which a foreigner labors in Japan, as, for example, imperfect knowledge of the language and inability to enter intimately into the life of the people, there are certain phases of the work for which he is perhaps better qualified than any but exceptional Japanese. He has a positive grasp of the truths of Christianity, to which it is difficult for those to attain to whom the faith is not an inheritance. He has behind him the long centuries of Christian traditions. The Church for him means not only the brave little band of Christians in Japan, but the great Church of the home land, with its history of past triumphs and its consciousness of present strength. pioneer evangelistic work in remote districts these things give him a certain advantage even over his Japanese brother, who may be in other respects better qualified and more efficient. Again, his very ignorance of the language and separation from the life of the community protect him from the disheartening influences of an indifferent or hostile social environment.

But apart from these considerations, the supply of Japanese clergy is insufficient to carry on the work already begun, to say nothing of expansion. At present there are in this diocese only three Japanese priests outside of Tokyo. To man the stations already established we should have at least twenty. Even were there no further expansion it would be a long time before we could obtain this number of men; but surely we expect the work to grow, and growth means a demand for more workers. The yearly additions to our Japanese staff will for some time to come do no more than meet the increasing demand. In other words, to supply the exigencies of country work already begun we need seventeen foreign priests. At present we have seven.

This estimate does not take into consideration large and important districts in which as yet our Church has no work at all. Were we to consider only the needs of these as yet unevangelized communities there would be ample opportunity for an almost unlimited number of missionaries. A foreigner, however, is of little use without a Japanese assistant, and the supply of catechists is limited. Furthermore, as our aim is to build up a self-supporting native Church, we must devote ourselves to the strengthening of centres already established rather than to indefinite expansion. Therefore, perhaps five additional men would suffice for the present for what may be called new work. Later on, as the Japanese begin to take over the churches already organized, foreign workers will be set free to go into the unoccupied districts. My conclusion, therefore, is that we need, and shall need for many years to come, a force of at least twenty foreign priests to meet the needs of the country evangelistic work in the District of Tokyo. This is exclusive of those needed for institutional work or for service in Tokyo city. I have no doubt that there is equally as urgent a need for missionaries in the Kyoto District.

A short description of the method of carrying on country work will perhaps explain more vividly than bare statistics the need for more workers and the opportunities for ordained men in Japan. A glance at the map of the missionary district of Tokyo will show that outside of Tokyo city there are eleven groups of stations. These groups follow the main railway lines, which run out from Tokyo somewhat like the limbs and branches of a great tree. The plan has been to reach out into the more important and accessible sections of the country and yet maintain connection with a common centre. When a new centre of work is opened a single missionary is sent to the most important point in the district. His work is at first confined to the city in which he resides, but after a while he begins of necessity to give attention to the district as a whole, opening up new stations in strategic points. It may be that some of his own Christians, or some from other districts, move to a nearby town; or it may be a call from non-Christians, anxious to hear the Gospel, that determines him to begin work at a new point. After a few years he finds himself with a group of small stations under his When his work reaches this stage of development it is absolutely essential to its welfare that he shall be reinforced by a second priest. Otherwise his time and energy will be so taken up in out-station work that he cannot devote himself to building up a strong, self-supporting church at the central point. He must develop the out-stations, for not only are they feeders for the

main church, but there is a constant migration to them of Christians from the larger cities.

The progress of the work in Japan is greatly hampered by the fact that we have not a force large enough to do these two things—develop the centres and still maintain the out-stations. Both are essential to real growth and real advance toward the ideal of a self-supporting, independent Japanese Church. If anyone will take the trouble to examine the statistics of the Japan mission for the last ten years he will find that while there has been a steady increase in the total number of communicants in the district, yet there has been but little growth in the central country churches themselves. But the sine qua non of an independent Japanese Church is a network of independent congregations in the important towns throughout the country. Were the number of communicants ten times what it is, if they are simply scattered about in little non-self-supporting mission stations, we should be no nearer independence than at present. The lack of continuous growth in the central points is therefore a very serious phenomenon and calls for explanation.

One explanation of this is obvious. The reinforcement of the mission staff has not kept pace with the natural development of the work. In 1898 the bishop of this district, realizing that the time was ripe for the development of the country work, sent home a stirring appeal for men. There was a splendid response and within two years seven men were added to his staff. He was consequently encouraged to put into practice his plan of occupying the strategic points throughout the district. In some of these, indeed, work was already being carried on, so that within a few years he was enabled, with the help of the new men, to establish central stations in nearly all the provinces north of Tokyo. But the success of this policy of expansion was clearly dependent upon the constant reinforcement of his staff. In the beginning the men were sent out

singly, for one priest was sufficient so long as the work was to a large extent confined to the one central station. For the first few years these stations made steady progress, but with the natural and necessary development of out-stations, a large part of the missionary's time was drawn away from the central church. This was the point at which a second man became necessary, but unfortunately it was just at this point that men were not forthcoming. To carry out the policy inaugurated in 1898 we should have had on an average two new men every year. But instead of this only two ordained men have come to us during the period from 1900 to 1910. Furthermore, during this period we have lost four men from the country work. The result is that we have only ten men (including three Japanese priests) to carry on a work for which twenty-two are absolutely essential.

This statement of our needs does not. however, give any ground for pessimism in regard to the work in Japan. It is no confession of failure. On the contrary, it means that during the past ten years a firm basis has been laid for a magnificent forward movement. The preliminary task of occupying the territory has been accomplished. The seeds of future churches have been planted in important points. But already the time has come when we must give our attention to the development of these churches into fullgrown, self-nourishing organisms. In some of them, indeed, this work should have been begun several years ago. But the loss caused by this delay, while unfortunate, is not irreparable. Speaking generally, the critical point has only just been reached. But it has been reached. and from now on we must have more men or the work will stand still. Give us these men-that is, give us the means of maintaining the progress already begun-and we believe that we can promise the realization of the vision that first brought us to Japan-an independent Nippon Sei Ko Kwai.

But our appeal for men is based not only upon the fact that without them the work will stand still. The need in our country stations for more foreign workers is a present need. We are not carving a Church out of a block of stone, on which we can work when and how we choose. We are training and developing a living organism, and in such a task each opportunity must be seized as it presents itself or it may never recur. Our country churches if taken in hand now give promise of growth into vigorous manhood. Who knows what will be their condition if left to languish for lack of nourishment during the next ten or twenty years?

Furthermore, we are working in an ever-changing environment. At present the conditions are favorable for the work of the foreign missionary. There are difficulties, to be sure. The time has gone by when he is looked up to as a paragon of wisdom and virtue simply because he comes from over the seas. But still the man who is truly a man, and the Christian who is truly a Christian, can exercise a widespread influence and find ample opportunities for usefulness. The courteous Japanese still preserve a grave face, in spite of his awful blunders in grammar, and forgive his unintentional rudenesses. Any man who comes to Japan now can come with the expectation of "leaving his bones here" after a life well spent in useful service.

It must be evident to everyone who reads the signs of the times that this nation is destined to play an important part in the civilization of the future. She is the pioneer in every line of progress in the Far East. Surely, therefore, the development of the Church of Japan is a matter of transcendent importance. All who know the situation here are agreed that the present is the time of favorable opportunity for Christian work. I have tried to show that it is a time of crisis in our own Church,

Ten years ago the American Church gave seven men to the Nippon Sei Ko Kwai. Can we not have seven more this year to join in the work of building a permanent Church upon the foundation that has been already laid?

A NAVAL OFFICER'S WITNESS TO CHRISTIAN MISSIONS

By Rear-Admiral Charles H. Stockton, U. S. N. (Retired)

AM sorry to hear that some naval officers are quoted as being unfriendly to foreign missions at the present day. My experience, especially with Chinese and Japanese missions, formed upon two cruises in eastern waters, is entirely to the contrary.

At one time it used to be said with relation to the East that there were no Sundays east of Singapore. port opinion and treaty port life in the East at that time were not unnaturally opposed to missionaries and all that they represented in behalf of the Chinese especially, and the Christianity they sought to convey to them. Results in the early days were meagre in the eastern countries. It was truly the seed-time of the Church. Now any one who has visited China, Japan or Korea with clear vision must know that the harvest time has set in, and with no greater success to any missionaries than those from our own country.

I remember when a lad reading the first address that I had ever met with from a layman in advocacy of missions. It was delivered by Rear Admiral (then Commodore) S. F. Du Pont at the session of the General Convention of the Church at Richmond, Va., in 1859. Commodore Du Pont had recently returned from a cruise in the East and spoke with a personal knowledge of the facts. The navy had at that time no officer who stood higher as an officer of high standards than Du Pont.

At the present time there is no officer in our navy with greater and more world-wide reputation than Rear Admiral A. T. Mahan. His services in behalf of foreign missions as a leading member of the General Board of Missions and in connection with the Laymen's Missionary Movement, are too well known to the Church at large to call for more than mention on my part. He, too, by cruises in the East, has seen the missionary at work in the eastern field.

I know of other officers of the service who have testified to the same effect, not only in public by addresses, but privately by contributions and memorials made while on the spot, or from knowledge guided by observation while there.

My own experience, about which I can speak more freely, was gathered on two cruises in the East during which I made frequent visits to missions of our own and other churches in China, Japan and Korea, making myself to an extent an unofficial inspector in many directions. I doubt whether any officers in the navy have of late years availed themselves of the opportunities to do so to a greater extent than myself.

While in command of the Yorktown I went up the Yangtze as far as Hankow and had not only the opportunity of seeing what had been done in Hankow under Bishop Ingle but also the Boone School and its surrounding mission buildings, then under the direction of the present Bishop Roots.

My second cruise, in command of the Kentucky, was limited to the larger ports and the establishments thereabouts, but I renewed my acquaintanceship of the mission houses at Jessfield near Shanghai and St. John's College, Shanghai, whose efficient work has evoked admiration from English visitors like Lord William Cecil, none too eager to express admiration for purely American educational establishments.

It was then also that I saw more of the mission work of Tokyo and its vicinity and the hospital in Tsukiji. In China the mission hospital stands for more good than in Japan. Japan has adopted the modern system of medicine and surgery. China as a whole and the Chinese as a mass cling to the grotesque curing art of the past. St. Luke's Hospital in Shanghai does noble work which is appealing to the Chinese of all classes who contribute toward its up-keep. I am under the impression also that the contributions toward the enlargement and expansion of that hospital from one of the physicians attached to it and his family, equal, if they do not exceed, the total amount given by some of our own dioceses to the cause of foreign missions in the past year.

The day of spectacular heroism has gone by in most, if not all, of our treaty ports of China, Japan and Korea. In most of the ports the missionaries enjoy the benefit of cheap labor and a silver currency to the effect that they can be housed and live on equal terms with European clerks and foremen. In the interior of China, and so far as travelling evangelists are concerned, this case does not prevail, and hardships are largely habitual matters with them as pioneers in the work.

I find myself singularly in accord with a recent writer in the London Spectator with respect to these men and their services to civilization and Christianity, when he says that nine out of ten, even of those who write comparatively intelligent books about China, at most deal with the missionary in the treaty ports and leave out of account the missionary pioneer in the interior, though he belongs to a class at once more numerous and more important.

Without missionary spirit a Church lacks life and progress, and I believe that this spirit should not be confined to the limitations of parish, diocese, section or country. All of these have their demands and all their needs, and any discrimination as to race, color, or region is to my mind so much of a failure in Christian duty.

THE PRESIDENT'S OPINION

DRESIDENT TAFT, speaking recently at a meeting in New York commemorating the diamond jubilee of Methodist mission work in Africa, defined a mission station as "a nucleus and an epitome of the civilization that is expected to widen out in that neighborhood." Continuing, Mr. Taft said: "I have heard missions criticised. I have heard men say that they would not contribute to foreign missions at all; that we have wicked people enough at home, and we might just as well leave the foreign natives and savages to pursue their own happy lives in the forests, and look after our own who need a great deal of ministration.

"I have come to regard that as narrow-minded, like the case of a man who does not understand the things that God has provided for the elevation of the human race.

"The missionaries in China, the missionaries in Africa, are the forerunners of our civilization, and without them we would have no hope of conquering the love and the admiration and the respect of the millions of people that we hope to bring under the influence of the Christian civilization.

"Those who go for mercantile purposes into those distant lands, I am sorry to say, are quicker to catch the savage tendencies than the savages are to catch from them the best of our Christian civilization, and if they had to depend, for their belief in the good that is to come to them from embracing Christianity and accepting the civilization that we offer them, upon that which they learned from the adventurers that go far into the interior to buy things from them at a price much below what ought to be paid, we should never succeed at all. I say that with all the sense of moderation that I know I ought to have in dealing with countries so far from here, and in saying things that cannot be contradicted."

THE BURNING OF AOMORI, JAPAN

N Tuesday, May 3d, within four hours' time, practically the entire old city of Aomori disappeared before the resistless advance of a great conflagration. About 7,000 buildings were destroyed and ninetenths of the inhabitants made homeless. The loss is estimated at 3,000,000 yen. Our mission there, established in 1893, is under the charge of the Rev. J. C. Ambler, who lives in Hirosaki. Our resident woman worker, Miss Flora M. Bristowe, tells of her experience:

"The fire started at Yamata and then caught the big temple. A fierce wind drove on the flames, which soon burned our church, and also every mission church or preaching place in Aomori. Just before the fire reached our house it turned to the north and for the time we

were safe. I felt happy, and went to see how some of our Christians and native workers were getting on. As I reached them the second temple caught. I found them in a terrible state, getting ready to flee and not knowing where to go. Returning home, I found that the fire was sweeping down on us from two directions. The people who had been helping us were gone, and the sparks were falling in showers upon our roof with no one to sweep them off or pour on water, though a neighbor had already swept the sparks from our out-house. If the fire crossed the street we could not be saved; so we decided to go over into the burned section and wait our fate. We got our things out and put them where the church had stood. As it was five hours since it burned, the place had pretty well cooled before we put our belongings there. Until seven P.M. we were not out of danger. We got some food at ten and kept watch all night because there was still so much débris burning, and all night and today "go-downs" have been bursting into flame. We are all quite safe now, have plenty of food, and have got our belongings back into the house. There are terrible tales of distress, and, I fear, a great loss of life."

Miss Wall, our woman worker at Hirosaki, who the morning after the fire accompanied Mr. Ambler to Aomori, gives more details about the suffering and loss of life:

"Aomori is practically a waste. The fire burned in three directions, leaving the railway station and a strip of buildings, but swallowing up practically everything else. We were glad to find that though the combined church and parish house is gone, Miss Bristowe's house was saved, as was also the house in which the sewing-school was heldthe one which Bishop McKim and Dr. Lloyd both hoped would burn. So close did the fire come to Miss Bristowe's dwelling that part of the fence at the back was at one time in flames and the house so filled with smoke that they could distinguish nothing. We found her very thankful for the Providence which had spared her home. we asked her to return with us, she felt her place was there and was already planning to shelter children whose parents were lost in the fire."

Our church was a two-storied building, used also as a parish house and the home of the kindergarten.

In addition to these two communications the following letter has been received from Bishop McKim;

"All the Christians except two were burned out,' and the distress among the 35,000 sufferers is pitiable; it is a great mercy that summer instead of winter is approaching. What would those houseless and starving multitudes have done

had this happened two months earlier, with the keen winds from Siberia piercing them and several feet of snow on the ground! We are doing all we can to help and have issued appeals through the press, not for our own people, but for general relief.

"We had an insurance equal to the original cost of our building, but prices have so advanced in fifteen years that we cannot rebuild the same structure for less than double the amount. The Christians, having lost everything, will find it a struggle to continue their weekly contributions, and can do nothing toward rebuilding.

"We want if possible to build church and parish house separately; will not the Church at home help us to build the church if we take the responsibility for the parish house? We can build a brick church for \$7,500.

"It is a pleasure to report that Miss Bristowe is safe and her house one of the few untouched by the fire. Our deacon, who lived in the parsonage, which was burned with the church, saved all his belongings, with the exception of his kitchen furniture."

VIOLENT DEATH OF A FORMER MISSIONARY

I ISS MARION TAYLOR, who for over ten years was one of our missionaries among the Indians on the Pyramid Lake Reservation in Nevada. met with a violent death on May 17th. while crossing a railway bridge over the canon near Verdi, being struck by an engine and thrown into the gully below. The accident was due to Miss Taylor's extreme deafness, the crew of the locomotive supposing until too late that she would hear their signals and turn aside. Her death was instantaneous. Her body was taken to Reno for burial. Miss Taylor retired from active service under the Board over a year ago.

NEWS AND NOTES

ST. PAUL'S CHURCH, Rochester, N. Y., is just closing a memorable missionary year. Not only has the apportionment been given with a very comfortable surplus to assist the Board in meeting its appropriations, but gifts for special purposes bring the total given by the people of St. Paul's to \$9,729.40. During the past winter there have come from St. Paul's two gifts, making possible the erection of two hospitals, one for China and one for Alaska.

ANY people will remember with pleasure the stirring addresses made in many parts of the country by the Rev. Irvine H. Correll, D.D., during his furlough. Dr. Correll left this country in February to return to his post. He writes that he finds the opportunities for work in Tsu greater than ever before. He has begun at once to put through the plans for the erection of suitable buildings for the mission. The outlook is most favorable. Unfortunately Dr. Correll was obliged to return before he had secured the full \$12,500 needed for the church, parish house, Japanese clergyman's residence, and foreign residence. The amount needed to complete the fund is \$1,700. Dr. Correll has returned to his work in the confidence that the important project for which he is responsible will not be forgotten, but that at least \$1,700 in special gifts will be speedily forwarded to the Board of Missions, in order that all plans may be satisfactorily carried out. It would be no real economy to skimp the work on the buildings to the extent of \$1,700. Everyone who has had to do with any really important enterprise knows the viciousness of the philosophy which advises the cutting of the garment according to the cloth. There are times when the only thing to do is to get a bigger piece of cloth and cut the garment according to actual needs. That in a nutshell is the situation at Tsu.

Translation of an editorial from the Shun Pao, a daily Chinese-controlled paper in Shanghai, in its issue about April 18th:

THE mandarins do not fear the people at all. The people fear the mandarins most of all. That which the mandarins most fear is that there should be any disturbance of the Christians. The one thing that the people can do to frighten the mandarins is to disturb the Church. For these reasons, no matter in what place a riot may start up, the people are certain first of all to vent their spite by disturbing the Christians and the Church. It is not that the people necessarily have any grudge against the Church, but they thoroughly hate the Therefore they use this mandarins. method of showing their hatred. When the riots are over and peace restored then the mandarins use this destruction of the churches to frighten the people (or to oppress them). The ignorance of the people, after all, is not equal to the wisdom of the mandarins. Therefore the people suffer.

N Friday, May 20th, at the Chapel of the Good Shepherd, West Berkeley, Cal., Miss Mabel Howard Pick was set apart as a deaconess by Bishop Rowe of Alaska. In the chancel with the bishop were the clergy of St. Mark's parish, Berkeley, and Dean Gresham, of Grace Cathedral, San Francisco. The bishop preached the sermon and the candidate was presented by the Rev. William Higgs, vicar of the Good Shepherd, under whom Miss Pick has been at work while connected with the deaconess school in Berkeley, from which she has just graduated. Deaconess Pick was appointed by the Board of Missions on May 10th, to work in the district of Alaska, and will sail for Wrangell in about a month.

Writing of the first service held in the new chapel at the University of the South, the chaplain, the Rev. Arthur R. Gray, says:

HEREWITH enclose a check for \$45. It represents the first offering taken in the new university chapel. After waiting many years for a chapel, and sometimes despairing whether we ever should have one, at last our dream is realized. It seemed most fitting that the offering made at the first celebration of the Holy Communion held in this chapel should be sent to St. John's College, Shanghai. I hope that in the future we shall not only be able to realize that there should be a more vital connection between Sewanee and St. John's, but that we may also be able to send men to help carry on the work.

S T. JOHN'S UNIVERSITY, Shanghai, has been significantly placed by the Joint Board of Examiners of the Scottish Universities on a par with the English Universities. The Joint Board has provided that examinations in the arts' curriculum of St. John's, taken and passed by the graduates of that university, shall exempt them from corresponding preliminary examinations of the Joint Board of Scottish Examiners.

SUMMER school for Sunday-school teachers of the Diocese of Pennsylvania will be held at Pocono Pines, Pa., August 21st to 27th. Among those who will conduct courses on Bible study, missions in the Sunday-school, the Prayer Book, etc., are the Rev. L. N. Caley, the Rev. W. E. Gardner, Secretary for the Department of New England, the Rev. T. J. Garland, Secretary for the Third Department, and the Rev. W. Herbert Burk. Bishop Darlington will hold the services on August 21st. Further particulars may be had by applying to the Rev. H. L. Duhring, D.D., 225 South Third Street, Philadelphia. THE Diocese of Quincy has the enviable record of being the first in the Fifth Department to complete its apportionment, which it did by June 1st. Last year also this was the first diocese in its department to complete the minimum sum asked by the Board, but this year the amount has been raised much earlier, thus setting a commendable example of promptness in payment.

A T a recent visit by the Bishop of Western Colorado to Ouray in that district, both the Roman Catholic and the Presbyterian churches omitted their services on Sunday evening. The Presbyterian minister read the lessons at the Church service, the Roman Catholic choir led the singing, and Bishop Brewster preached on "Christian Unity."

THE Brotherhood of St. Andrew will hold its twenty-fifth annual convention in Nashville, Tenn., September 28th to October 2d, 1910. The sessions will be held in the chamber of the House of Representatives in the State Capitol. It is expected that from 1,500 to 2,000 delegates and visitors will be in attendance. No doubt many men of international prominence will visit the Brotherhood Convention on their way to the General Convention at Cincinnati, which convenes immediately after the former meeting.

A N interesting pamphlet sets forth the work done at St. Luke's Home, Phænix, Arizona. It was designed for the treatment of tuberculosis and with the exception of the Oakes Home at Denver is the only institution of the kind under the control of the Church. Archdeacon Atwood has oversight of the work, which is growing—though not in proportion to the increasing demand. Last year sixty persons were cared for.

OUR LETTER BOX

Intimate and Informal Messages from the Field

A clergyman in a Middle Western diocese writes to a friend, who had recently told the members of the congregation of the successful work of his men in securing larger gifts for the Church's Mission:

"I OUGHT to thank you again for your goodness in coming out for us that night. Our canvass proceeds encouragingly. We have already pledges exceeding all apportionments. Eighty people have subscribed \$641 for missions. Many more are yet to be heard from. I am now working for \$1,000. In addition we are planning to spend about \$4,000 on our property this year (debt and improvements). Moreover, the vestry materially increased my salary last night. Simply proofs that unselfishness pays selfishly."

Last year the same congregation, with more than 300 communicants, made an offering of \$10.15 for general missions.

The writer from whose letter the following is taken is an earnest young Colored man, a school teacher, who for love of the Church and without compensation is trying to do what he can in that destitute part of Oklahoma where his work places him.

NONE but those actually engaged in the Vineyard of our Master, and working for the spread of His Kingdom can fully appreciate The Spirit of Mis-Sent by some kind friend it reaches me when discouragement seems to press me close; it cheers me in lonely hours and keeps me in touch with the Church. To-day I am forty-five miles from the nearest church and the cost of attendance is prohibitive. I walk five miles and board the train for Ft. Smith, Arkansas. I reach the latter place at midnight and stay until morning. means ten miles' walk, \$1.80 railroad fare and forty hours time, besides board and lodging.

But I have at my side my Bible, and Prayer Book. These are my constant companions. As I follow the trails through primeval forests I read and study the best way to introduce the Church to these people. It is almost unknown here. One otherwise intelligent old man, who laughed on for half an hour when I told that I was a member of the Episcopal Church, said: "Who ever heard of such a Church?"

There are three classes of people here—white, red, and colored. I work among the colored, but I have been able to teach some of the Church doctrines to all classes,

The colored children may be divided into two classes-those with land and those without land. All children of mixed colored and Indian blood, and children descended from former slaves of Indians, have land which was allotted by the Government. The amount varies from 40 to 360 acres. After it was allotted, on some land oil was found. Thus one child may have eighty acres of good farming land worth \$1,600, and another have the same amount, but oil is found on the second and the owner gets a royalty. In one case I know a boy who draws \$100 a week royalty while his brother gets nothing in this way.

Then come the children without land—mostly immigrants from other States, or those who are not counted with the Indians, or the large number who have been "juggled" out of their land without any return. Here you find abject poverty. How the Church could change the lives of these people! Many are dissatisfied with present conditions, and for them the Church would fill the "long felt want."

I only wanted to tell you why The Spirit of Missions was so doubly dear to me, so far from services and in a religious desert, as far as the Church is concerned.

A VISIT TO FORT DEFIANCE

Miss Alice Jay, accompanied by a friend, recently made a trip to Fort Defiance, Ariz., where is located the chapel erected as a memorial to her sister, Miss Cornelia Jay. The work carried on there by Miss Thackara is well known to all friends and lovers of the missionary cause.

ROM Chicago we travelled for forty-eight hours by the interesting Santa Fe route to Gallup, New Mexico, the point on the railway nearest to Fort Defiance; thence with canvascovered surrey and fine pair of horses the remaining thirty-five miles.

The road led across the sandy waste of Arizona desert at an elevation of 7,500 feet. Everything was of the same dust color-a peculiarly lifeless and monotonous landscape. There were no birds nor flowers, only sage-brush and grease-bush, with an occasional juniper. Two flocks of sheep and goats and the prairie dogs were the only visible signs of life. Except the "Damon" place not a house until we came in sight of that little cluster of hospital buildings, down in the valley, which, with the new chapel nearby, loomed up most impressively and in striking contrast to the general desolation through which we had been driving for five hours.

We descended the long hill from Black


Rock, crossed the arroyo, and drove up in front of the hospital. Miss Thackara gave us a hearty welcome, while her red children stood by, interested spectators. What it meant to her to see friends from the East will be appreciated by one who remembers the necessary isolation attending her fourteen years of patient, faithful, loving service among the sick Indians.

First came the tour of the buildings. including the stable. On the left of the little entrance hall was the small reception room, behind this the women's ward. At the right of the entrance hall was the tiny dining room used by Miss Thackara. Adjoining this was the little kitchen and Indians' dining-room, pantry, etc. There were four rooms on the second floor, one of which was used as a children's ward. A detached building consisting of three small rooms was the men's ward. There was also a specially constructed small building for tuberculous patients. In the centre of the building on the main floor was the operating room, with one window and three sides dark.

In our hospitals in the East a surgeon is considered great if he operates successfully with the best equipment and all modern conveniences, while here, with no electric light, not even gas, Dr. Wigglesworth had just performed an operation for appendicitis, and I saw the man, who was then convalescent! But an even greater marvel is the woman with the courage to run a hospital for the Indians without a bath-room! and no modern conveniences. There is a well at some distance from the house, but the water is so strong of alkali that it can be tasted in tea. Fortunately a kind friend has come to the rescue, and nearly enough is in hand to bring the spring water over from the Fort. The pipes for this will be laid as soon as the weather permits.


Miss Thackara's great desire is to have a native Catechist established there who will reach the souls of the Indians, but I fear I should reverse the old proverb and put cleanliness first. I would like to see a new operating-room and the old one turned into a much-needed bathroom.

We finally reached the beautiful new

chapel. On the corner-stone was written: "The Chapel of the Good Shepherd, to the Glory of God and in Loving Memory of Cornelia Jay."

It seems eminently fitting that the many friends throughout the country who knew of her years of devotion to the cause of the Indians and to Foreign Missions should have created this enduring monument to her memory. The chapel is complete and all paid for, including the windows, which are of stained glass. The furniture has also been given by friends. The building is of grey stone, quarried within half a mile under the direct supervision of Miss Thackara, to whose forceful energy and constant vigilance is due the perfect chapel it now appears. The Indians are much impressed and come from great distances to see it. The white marble font is their especial admiration. They go up and touch it wonderingly, saying they "never saw stone like that before."

The morning following our arrival I was asked to be down to prayers at seven o'clock. "The Indians expected it." Each one was formally introduced as he appeared: Denatchely, Huskydaws, Henry Whipple, Thomas Atkinson—all the way down to the cook's baby girl, Adelchee. Little Jim, with his crooked spine, won my heart and sympathy from

the first. His little face was bright and intelligent, yet with such a wistful and pathetic expression of endurance.

After prayers we saw them all at breakfast, which consisted of oatmeal, dry bread (never butter) and coffee. Including the help there were twenty-seven. More are coming to the hospital as they are able to break away from their superstitions, and the awful domination of the "medicine men."


Of necessity a nomadic tribe, the Navajos do not live—they exist. Their camp fires are to be seen all over the desert and they drive their flocks wherever the best grazing and water are to be found. There can be no better air in the world, yet their manner of life is the cause of so much tuberculosis and other diseases among them. From the hot, smoky interior of the "hogan" they emerge into the zero cold atmosphere, and no amount of added clothing would prevent the shock caused by the contrast. Ignorance of sanitary laws (which, however, if they understood, they could not follow because of the scarcity of waterthe first element required for their observance), is also a factor conducive to the prevalence of disease.

In a trip of four days to the Cañon de Chelly I experienced this lack of water, since when I have had more charity for the "dirty" Indian.

It is a sad, sad moment for a sick Indian when once his friends determine that he will not live. He is carried out of the hogan and deposited on the ground, in a protected place if there happen to be one, and there left alone to die. If allowed to die in the hogan the rest of the family would leave it at once, in possession of the *Chindee* (devil), which they fear and always associate with death.

The Hospital of the Good Shepherd has given "sanctuary" to many such, and with care they may be nursed back to health, or at least those last moments soothed by the "cup of cold water." And "Whosoever shall give to drink unto one of these little ones, a cup of cold water, in the name of a disciple, verily I say unto you, he shall in no wise lose his reward."

GRATITUDE FOR DELIVERANCE

HE following preamble and resolutions were presented to the Bishop of Mexico by a representative gathering of natives in that section where he and those whose interest he had aroused did so much to alleviate suffering and ward off death in the recent famine. We have been asked to give them as wide a publicity as possible in order that all who assisted in this good work may be reached by these words of thanks:

WHEREAS, On account of the heavy frosts in the Central Table Land, in the last part of last September, the crops were completely destroyed and a great number of laborers were ruined:

WHEREAS, In consequence of the great loss there has been an extreme lack of absolutely necessary grain, which has reached such exorbitant prices as to be absolutely out of the reach of the poverty-stricken, who have suffered unspeakably:

WHEREAS, When the Right Rev. H. D. Aves, Bishop of Mexico, was informed of the privation of the poor in this region, he tried, with paternal solicitude, in every possible way, to relieve that distress, and obtained enough money from our brethren of the American Church to buy several carloads of corn, which is now being distributed weekly from the parish house of this place, and

WHEREAS, In this beneficent work the said bishop has been efficiently helped, in the United States, by the Rev. Peter G. Sears, and the congregation of Christ Church, Houston, Tex.; and, in Mexico, by the American Consul-General, Mr. Philip C. Hanna, and by Mr. E. N. Brown, President of the National Railway of Mexico, and

WHEREAS, There is a debt of gratitude which we owe to the above-named persons, therefore, in

my own name and in that of the congregations of Hidalgo, we adopt the following resolutions:

1. Resolved: That we send a vote of thanks to the Right Reverend H. D. Aves, Bishop of Mexico, expressing our deep gratitude for the great benefit which has accrued to the poor of this jurisdiction, without any distinction of religious creed, but as a work truly philanthropic and Christian; which benefit has been extended to the congregations of Santa Maria Tlalmimilolpan and Mimiapan, State of Mexico, and San Miguel El Alto and Tlacotepec, in the State of Michoacan, and the town of San Andres Timilpan, State of Mexico:

2. Resolved: That we likewise extend this vote of thanks to Consul General Philip C. Hanna, and to Mr. E. N. Brown, for their highly-appreciated assistance in expediting the arrival of the corn, and in remitting all charges upon the cars which have been received.

3. Resolved: That we beseech the bishop, at his convenience, in our name, and in the name of all the beneficiaries, to render our grateful thanks to the faithful of the American Church, and to all those persons who so bountifully have contributed to alleviate the necessities of the poor, and in a special manner to express our gratitude to the Rev. Peter G. Sears, and to the congregation of Christ Church, Houston, Tex., for their activity and zeal in securing and sending most opportunely needed grain.

The convocation of the district of Mexico also adopted these preambles and resolutions as an expression of its sentiments, and voted that the names of the congregations of San Pedro Martir, Xochitengo, and San Pedro, Mexico City, be also included in the list of those who had been benefited by the benefactions of the persons named.

THE LITERATURE OF MISSIONS

The Religion of the Chinese, by J. J. M. Degroot, Ph.D. The Macmillan Company.

HE study of the religion of the Chinese is of interest not only to missionaries at work in the field, but to all who are anxious to understand the religious ideas of the non-Christian world. As Professor Degroot says in his introduction: "A proper understanding of the religions of East Asia in general requires in the first place an understanding of the religion of China."

The question is often asked, "What is the religion of the Chinese?" It is not easy to give a brief reply. In China we find a somewhat complex religious problem. In the first place, this is the primitive religion—that which Confucius in his writings sought to conserve; but in addition we have Buddhism, which came into China from India about the year 62 A.D., and Taoism, the cult which has grown out of the philosophical teaching of Laotse, a contemporary of Confucius. There has been a fusion of the three to form the popular religion of China.

Much has been written on the subject. Legge's scholarly work has enabled us to understand Confucianism. Edkins and Eitel have expounded Chinese Buddh-Several translations have been ism. made of the Taoist classic, the Tao-Teh King. Dr. Degroot is now engaged in writing his monumental work on "The Religious System of China," of which Volumes I—III have already been published. When completed this will be the most thorough and exhaustive study of the religion of China which has thus far appeared. In the meantime he has given us in the present volume, consisting of a course of lectures delivered at Hartford Theological Seminary, an excellent short handbook on the religion of China.

Any one desirous of getting a lucid and concise statement of the religious ideas of a people who form three-fourths of the world's population will be well repaid by a study of the book. The first part is devoted to an account of China's religion proper, as distinguished from Buddhism, which is of foreign introduction. The former, he tells us, is "a spontaneous product, spontaneously developed in the course of time."

Dr. Degroot finds that animism is the very core of the religion of China, "based upon an implicit belief in the animation of the universe, and of every being and thing which exists in it."

To quote his own words: "The universe is full of two souls or breaths, called Yang and Yin, the former representing light, warmth, productivity and life, also the heavens from which all these good things emanate; and the Yin being associated with darkness, cold, death, and the earth. The Yang is subdivided into an indefinite number of good souls or spirits, called Shen, and the Yin into evil spirits, called Kwei."

The belief in evil spirits, or *Kwei*, leads to Polydemonism, and the belief in good spirits, or *Shen*, to Polytheism.

As a consequence of Polydemonism he points out that China groups her religious acts around the ghosts and spirits, with the object of averting their wrath. "No people in this world ever was more enslaved to fear of spectres than the Chinese; no people, therefore, has excelled the Chinese in inventing means to render them harmless."

In Polytheism—the existence of the Shen—we find two classes of gods: (1) the gods of nature, Heaven and Earth, the Sun and Moon, and the spirits in the hills, streams and trees; and (2) the gods embodied in men. Each man has a Shen, and in a sense is a god. When he

dies his *Shen* still exists. Hence we can understand ancestral worship. It consists in offering sacrifices to the *Shen* of the departed.

In discussing the question as to whether ancestral worship is idolatrous, Dr. Degroot is very emphatic. He says: "Ancestral worship answers exactly to idolatry and fetichism, it being addressed to tablets, deemed just as well as images of gods to be inhabited by the souls of those whom they represent."

In the chapter on Confucianism, we learn that the classics handed down for so many years have exercised a great conservative influence. They have perpetuated the orthodox interpretation of the religious ideas of China, and helped to petrify the religious traditions and customs. In commenting upon the worship offered by the Emperor of China to "Imperial Heaven" or "The Supreme Emperor" (Shang Ti), Dr. Degroot gives what appears to us to be the true explanation. It is not, as some suppose, a vestige of an original monotheism, but "Imperial Heaven-Supreme Emperor" is worshipped "as the oldest, the original procreator" of the long line of earthly emperors. When missionaries use Shana Ti as the translation of the name of God, its connotation to the Chinese mind is very different from the Christian idea of God.

Concerning the conversion of China to Christianity, the author well says: "China's conversion will require no less than a complete revolution in her culture, knowledge, and mode of thought. In this connection we might note that the present intellectual awakening in China, and the adoption of a western system of education is full of hope for the cause of missions.

In the chapter on Taoism Dr. Degroot points out its affinity with many of the primitive religious ideas of China. As it exists at the present day it is a cult for the exorcism of demons, and for propitiating the gods. Its ritual is highly developed, and was created to a great extent in imitation of Buddhism.

The philosophy of Laotse himself was

probably derived from India. It is so abstruse that it has never appealed to the Chinese people as a whole,

The last two chapters of the book contain an account of Chinese Buddhism. As is well known, it was the northern form of Buddhism which made its way into China, and this differs materially from the southern form found in Burmah and Siam. It is much more adaptable to new conditions. It brought into China more definite ideas as to salvation from the world's miseries, and as to the purification of man's nature. Dr. Degroot ascribes its gaining a hold in the Empire of Confucian thought and ancestral worship to the fact that it provided a means for "salvation work on behalf of the dead."

There are only a few statements in Dr. Degroot's book which we could venture to criticise:

As will have been seen, he finds the dualistic principle in the primitive religion of China—the Yang and the Yin. Many scholars believe that this idea came into China from Persia. At all events, it is significant that no reference is made to it in the earliest Chinese Classics, the Book of History, and the oldest portions of the Book of Poetry. It is only found freely developed in the Book of Changes, which is of later date.

Dr. Degroot in all his writings emphasizes, contrary to current notions, the intolerance of the Chinese of all foreign religions, and calls attention to the frequent persecutions of Buddhism, Islam and Christianity. It is true that whenever a religious system interferes with the political or social constitution of China, it arouses opposition. The early Jesuit missionaries suffered persecution because it was feared that the Roman Catholic Church would set up in China an imperium in imperio. What opposition to Christianity there is at the present day is largely occasioned by the fact that the Church and State have been too closely associated in the Christian propaganda. Buddhism was persecuted because with its monastic system it completely undermined the social structure

of China, based on the family. The political ambitions of Islam have led to frequent serious rebellions in China. In the realm of ideas the Chinese have not been more intolerant than other people. They have been willing to allow the spread of ideas where the consequences upon the political, social, and moral life of the people have made for good, but naturally have been opposed to those ideas which resulted in disturbing influences.

We cannot do better than to close this review with the following words of the author, which show the appalling need of the Chinese for higher religious truth: "Most unhappy must be a people always living in a thousand—a hundred thousand—fears of invisible beings which surround the path of life with dangers on every hand, at every moment. If it is the will of God that man shall have a religion in order to be happy, the Chinese religion is certainly no religion shaped by God."

Nor did they dream of seeing, as they might see at Yale to-day, more than twenty groups of men studying missions.

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MISSIONS

June 14th, 1910

HE Board of Missions met at the Church Missions House, on Tuesday, June 14th, the Bishop of Pittsburgh in the chair. The following members were present: The Bishops of Pennsylvania, Bethlehem, Newark, New York, and the Bishop Coadjutor of Virginia; the Rev. Drs. Anstice and Parks, the Rev. Mr. Sedgwick and the Rev. Dr. Storrs; Messrs. Mills, Chauncey, Butler, King, Pepper, Pruyn and Ryerson. Of the honorary members, the Bishops of Olympia and Kyoto.

The Treasurer reported that there was a further gain in contributions of \$43,000 over June 1st of last year. The Lenten offering to June 11th, from 3,774 Sunday-schools, was \$128,704.13, an average of \$34.10 per school. During the same period last year \$133,072.28 were received from 3,679 Sunday-schools, an average of \$36.17 per school.

The Treasurer submitted a communication from the Bishop of Maine relinquishing further appropriation to his diocese from this Board after September 1st next. Whereupon these resolutions were adopted:

"Resolved: That the grateful thanks of the Board of Missions be extended to the Right Rev. Robert Codman, D.D., and to the Diocese of Maine for their recent action."

"That the Board highly appreciates the action of the Diocese of Maine, as communicated by its bishop, in relinquishing all assistance, and congratulates them upon the progress which this step indicates, especially in view of the fact that the Diocese of Maine pays its full missionary apportionment."

The Rev. John R. Harding, D.D., of

Utica, N. Y., who last autumn was nominated as Secretary of the Second Department, communicated his acceptance of the nomination; whereupon he was elected and the necessary appropriations made.

Letters were submitted from a large number of domestic bishops with regard to matters connected with their appropriations and the appointment of missionaries.

At the request of Bishop Rowe, the Rev. George Edward Renison, lately of San Francisco, was appointed to take charge of the work at Juneau.

Appropriations were made for Negro work for the next fiscal year from the amount set apart for the purpose at the last meeting, and permission was given to the committee to suggest such modifications at the next meeting as they may find to be necessary. In connection with this the following resolution was adopted:

"That notice be given to the bishops whose work among the Negroes is aided by this Board, that with the fiscal year beginning September 1st, 1911, appropriations to dioceses and districts for evangelistic work (or for other than that of schools) will not be made in excess of \$2 for each dollar raised for said work within the diocese or district."

An extra appropriation of \$180 was made under recommendation of a special committee to the Church in Haiti to cover, with the appropriation made last month, the needs of Bishop Holly as expressed in his estimate.

The Standing Committee on Audit reported that they had caused the books and accounts of the Treasurer to be examined to the first instant and had certified the same to be correct.

The Rev. John A. Staunton, Jr., being a deputy to the General Convention from the missionary district of the Philippines and, at the request of Bishop Brent, anticipating his furlough a few weeks, with his wife sailed from Manila June 2d by way of the Suez Canal.

MRS. HOBART E. STUDLEY, returning to Manila with her two children, left New York June 8th and sailed from Seattle by the steamer *Minnesota* on the 20th.

Africa

The Rev. Garretson W. Gibson, D.D. for many years a missionary of the Board and sometime President of the Republic of Liberia, died at Monrovia on April 26th in the seventy-eighth year of his age. He was ordained by Bishop Payne on January 15th, 1854.

THE appointment by the Bishop of Cape Palmas of the Rev. Robert Z. Johnstone, a West Indian and a recent graduate of the Philadelphia Divinity School, was approved by the Board on June 14th; it being understood that he would spend six months in the United States, awaiting Priest's Orders, before proceeding to Africa.

The resignation of Miss Ruth Margaret Dodge as an assistant at the Girls' Training Institute, Bromley, was accepted, to date from May 1st.

Hankow

The Rev. Edmund Lee Woodward, M.D., who received a special leave of absence two years ago in order to take a course at the Theological Seminary, Virginia, was advanced to the priesthood on June 17th and was married on the 22d to Miss Frances P. Gibson, daughter of the Bishop of Virginia. They sailed from New York by the steamer Minnetonka on June 25th. After spending the summer in England and Switzerland they will sail from Naples by the steamer Prinz Eitel Friedrich on August 26th for Shanghai.

Miss Emily L. Ridgely, Deaconess, was appointed as a missionary to Han-

kow at the instance of Bishop Roots, on June 14th. She will proceed to the field with her brother later in the summer.

MISS RUTH KENT, whose appointment was announced last month, has been compelled to decline acceptance of it on account of family reasons which have recently developed.


Work Among Negroes in the South

THE HOUSE OF THE HOLY CHILD, MANILA

By Frances W. Sibley

[Miss Sibley, the Michigan diocesan president of the Girls' Friendly Society, went out to Manila last winter, giving her services for a year during Deaconess Routledge's furlough at home. Bishop Brent says: "I wish her example might be followed, and that we could get more volunteers to give a year or so in the mission field."

HE House of the Holy Child is situated in the native part of Manila and is surrounded by nipa, or grass, huts, built on stilts to keep them out of the water in the rainy season. They would not look very home-like or comfortable to American eyes, but the thick thatched roof of grass keeps the sun and the rain off very well and they are the coolest kind of house, which is a great consideration in this country. In the midst of such huts as these stands our own abode, an old Spanish house built of stone and covered with lovely flowering vines, and with large shaded grounds where the children may play. On one side of the salon, or living room, are the rooms for the ladies

in charge, and on the other side live our little orphans, where we can see and hear them singing and playing. They have a dormitory in which each little girl has her own bed, except that four or five weak children sleep outdoors on a veranda. These little beds are covered with mosquito bar under which each child crawls at night, as into a cage. There is a dining-room like an enclosed porch. with a similar room for lessons. Downstairs is a small chapel where, after the half-past six o'clock breakfast, the day begins with prayers at seven. These are said in the Tagalog dialect, but the hymns are sung in English, which the children are learning. After prayers they have industrial work, making beds,

sweeping, washing dishes, washing and ironing their own clothes, which the older ones make for themselves. From nine to twelve is school. As the children are of different ages and speak several different dialects, this is rather a problem, but all are learning English. None of them are strong enough to be sent to the public school, and this is the best if not the easiest way to educate them. Part of their time is taken up with kindergarten games, and their voices sound very sweet as they sing their little songs. Lessons over, the family gathers again in the chapel, for noon intercessions for missions. The children are most reverent, with attentive little brown faces and folded hands. Directly after prayers comes dinner, and then everybody goes to bed to take a siesta. The long continued heat makes this necessary. The afternoon is taken up with baths, play for the little ones, and two hours' sewing for the older ones in the embroidery school in the guild room in connection with our little parish church, St. Luke's.

To me, coming as a stranger six weeks ago, this seems the most homelike and wholesome and natural way of taking care of little girls that I have ever seen. While in a way it makes the work more difficult, having the girls of such various ages, still it has distinct advantages. Each of the older ones is put in charge of a younger one, whom she bathes, dresses and looks after generally, as an older sister would. The larger girls take a commendable pride in their little charges, and we hope the experience may develop some of them into gentle, trustworthy nurses for children. Here is no suggestion of an institution. The children are devoted to the housemother, who takes the place of mother, teacher and playmate, and her sympathy and wise and gentle discipline cannot fail to have a lasting effect on their characters. It is hard to believe that the whole undertaking was started only seven months ago-it has so much the home atmosphere. I wish you could look in any evening at seven o'clock, when, just before the children go to bed, they have a merry half-hour of play or goodnight story, followed by a hymn and prayers at their bedside. The five tiny ones include with their "Now I lay me" fervent and original petitions for each individual member of the household, manifesting great anxiety lest anyone should be forgotten, just as our children do at home.

The equipment of the house is for thirty children. We have that number of beds, etc., and no doubt they will soon be full, if the question can be answered, "Where is the money for support to come from ?" The sum of money appropriated by the Board of Missions, with an occasional "special" from a thoughtful friend, barely enables Miss Buffington to carry on the work with the present number of children, but I am confident that when people learn how much good can be done with \$75-the amount which takes care of one girl for a yearthe money will come in.

The orphanage was opened in accordance with Bishop Brent's guiding principle, "Meet the greatest need." Sometimes needs are so great that one can meet only a piece of a need, and it is so in this case. After consultation with the Governor-General, the Board of Health and the Department of Police, who had emphasized this need, it was decided to give special attention to the children who are classed as "American

mestizas"-children who had American fathers and native mothers-of whom there are sadly great numbers in these far-away islands, and to confine the work to girls. The purpose was stated in the article of incorporation, something like this-"To give a Christian home and industrial training to Filipino and mestiza children, who are orphans, or who have been abandoned." thought unwise to exclude all but mestizas from the house, as it is important for them to grow up to live in happy and sympathetic relations with the Filipinos, so the rules admit of our receiving a few children who are not mestizas, and as I look over our family, I wonder if we could have had a greater variety in the same number, even if we had sought for it. The Filipino people are made up of various tribes, having differing characteristics and speaking different dialects, and we have in the house representatives of four tribes, besides our mestizas. In the case of every child who comes here, the understanding is that the Corporation of the House of the Holy Child becomes the guardian of the child until she becomes of age un-

der the laws of the Philippine Islands, and papers have to be signed to that effect.

It is a temptation to me to make this account still longer and to tell something of Deaconess Routledge's especial work in her school for embroidery for the native girls of the neighborhood-which we hope will give them a trade that will keep them out of the cigarette factories -her needlework exchange, to help the desperately poor native women, and her clubs and classes for boys and girls, which have had a remarkably steadying and refining influence on them. She is at present in America on her furlough, and it is to try to carry on at least a part of her work in her absence that I am here, at the bishop's invitation, spending a most interesting year at the Settlement House. For these efforts toward social uplift we have absolutely no appropriation from the Board, and the deaconess has, I know, spent many anxious and wearing hours, trying to devise plans to make the two ends meether resources being the scanty proceeds from her Exchange and now and again a very welcome "special" from home.

THE LAST THREE MONTHS

S the summer passes we would remind our leaders of the approaching Triennial of the Woman's Auxiliary. On account of the accommodations in Cincinnati our usual programme will be somewhat changed. Instead of holding the general meeting on the afternoon of Thursday, October 6, it is now planned to hold it in the Music Hall on the afternoon of Saturday, the 8th. It would make so long an interval between the United Offering Service on the morning of Thursday, and the United Offering Meeting on the afternoon of Saturday, that it seems best to have the service on Saturday morning.

In compliance with the wish expressed by many of the Auxiliary, the service will be held at 8 o'clock, in Christ Church, Cincinnati. So many worshippers are apt to gather on this occasion, that the church may be more than filled, and to accommodate those who shall be disappointed, it is expected that St. Paul's Church will be opened for the Service of Holy Communion, to begin a quarter of an hour later. Thus those who cannot attend at Christ Church may go from there to St. Paul's. The Music Hall will accommodate so large a number that we hope no one may be disappointed in gaining admittance there in the afternoon.

We are sure that in all branches of the Auxiliary earnest efforts are being made in these remaining months to increase the amount of the United Offering; and we hope that the apportionment of the Woman's Auxiliary is also remembered, and that, in branches where the sum suggested has not yet been given, an earnest endeavor is now being made to complete or surpass the amount. These summer months are the time to make known these objects of our interest to our friends and to the new acquaintances whom we may meet in our journeyings and visits. Are they not also the time when we may remember in our prayers those who in their work for Christ and the upbuilding of His Church have so little holiday, asking that needed reinforcements may soon be sent to strengthen the posts where the working force is now so small?

THE UNITED OFFERING IN TEXAS

[A paper prepared by Mrs. F. W. Catterall, Custodian of the United Offering, in the Texas Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary.]

N 1904 the United Offering from the Diocese of Texas was \$246.68. In 1907, it was \$561.61. The entire United Offering was \$224,251.55. The United Offering is completed every three years, and the next one will be presented at Cincinnati in October of 1910. We have now in the bank \$502.08, and there is one more collection before October.

How much are we going to send from the diocese of Texas? Let us try to make a larger offering than ever before, for the United Offering follows this rule: As the work grows, so shall the offering grow. We have only the summer months in which to work for this United Offering, and it is an accepted fact that the summer time is not our working time. That rule may apply to some departments of Church work, but this is different. This work we may carry with us when we go away, and we may also enjoy its privileges among the restful pleasures of a summer at home. So I am going to ask you to take with you some of the little blue boxes and some of the leaflets, and use all diligence and zeal to bring this work to the knowledge and understanding of every Churchwoman in your parish or mission.

Now, because there are so many departments of the Auxiliary work, and because this one is so entirely independent and distinct from all other departments, I shall ask you to let me explain exactly what is the United Offering, who gives it, and for what it is given.

In the first place, what is the United Offering? The United Offering is a It is placed on the Thank-offering. Triennial Service of altar at the Thanksgiving, at the time when the Woman's Auxiliary has its Triennial meeting, and also at the time and place where the Church holds its General Convention. It is the national Thankoffering of our women. It is the expression of our gratitude for the Christian privileges which we enjoy; and while it expresses our thankfulness, it also kindles our thankfulness. Who that has ever been present at one of these services and joined in the hymn of praise which goes up with the presentation of the offering, but has thrilled with the joy of giving thanks? Who can contemplate with indifference the gift of \$224,000, almost a quarter of a million, laid upon the Altar of God by the women of the Church, and remember that with that gift, and because of that gift, more than 160 women have been able to give themselves to missionary work?

Who gives the United Offering? It is given by the women and girls of the American Church and its missions, not Auxiliary members only, but all women. It excuses no one from any other obligation, and it entails no other obligation, except that, to our united gifts there shall be added our united and earnest prayers that God will put it into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to the work of the Master in the mission field. The United Offering

of 1907 represented the gifts of eightytwo dioceses of the American Church, including Honolulu, the Philippines, Porto Rico and Alaska, and besides these there were offerings from our foreign missions in Mexico, Brazil, Cuba, Haiti,

China, Japan and Africa.

Many of us use the little blue boxes, accumulating small sums slowly; some of us prefer to make a semi-annual offering. Some who give it do no other work for the Church's missions, and some are the most generous and diligent in every branch of the Church's work, and yet feel they can afford to give, if only a small sum, so that they may share in this Thank-offering.

The United Offering is collected each spring and fall, and sent to the United Offering treasurer in the diocese, who deposits the offering in the bank, and at the time of the Triennial Service of Thanksgiving takes or sends it, together with the interest it has earned, to be placed on the great golden alms-basin that is used for the purpose. And then the Board of Missions distributes it among the women workers in the mission field. Of the offering of 1910 \$15,000 will be devoted toward some mission building or buildings. A part of the remainder will be used to train the inexperienced volunteers in Church trainingschools, or otherwise to fit them for the arduous work they would undertake. Some of it will send women out to their field of work, some of it will support them there, and some of it will care for those who may be sick or disabled.

The United Offering missionaries in the United States are working among the Indians, the Negroes, the mountain people of the Appalachian plateau, and in other places where there is need of a trained woman worker under the direction of the bishop. Their work is very obviously a national gain. The results are measured in better citizenship, in higher standards of intelligence, as well as of religion and morals; in habits of industry and thrift, in happier childhood, and old age that is more contented and revered. These United Offering mis-

sionaries, in kindergartens, schools and hospitals, are also helping to assimilate the vast hordes of immigrants-one of the most serious problems of our Republic.

Others of these women, United Offering missionaries, are in Alaska. Some are in Honolulu, in Porto Rico, in the Philippines. If you do not realize the good they are doing, if you do not know the wonderful results of missionary labors, take down your file of Spirit of Missions. Read the articles written by our Travelling Secretary, by Archdeacon Stuck and Bishop Rowe, by Bishop Kinsolving of Brazil, by Bishop Aves of Mexico, and many others. Travellers, writers, students, agree that the age is ripe for missionary work. The bars are down, the gates are open. Everywhere ignorance is looking toward the light.

In the foreign field, supported by the United Offering, are nurses, teachers, mission workers; a little band carrying in their hands the torch of civilization, the balm of healing, the Message of Salvation. Comparatively, there are not many who hear the call and who are willing to go. There are not many who have the faith and courage and happy optimism. One woman, when reminded of the discouragements and delays of foreign mission work, answered: "Yes; but one of these girls in the mission school may be the mother of a Moses who will lead his people out of bondage." The girls are, indeed, the hope of the Woman's Auxiliary; the future mothers and teachers in heathen countries, and also the future workers in our own country.

To the Junior Auxiliary, in particular, comes the call for more volunteers. They have not yet assumed the obligations of maturity, and they have the courage and enthusiasm of youth. We believe there are many members of the Junior Auxiliary who are unconsciously fitting themselves to become missionaries; there are many who long to do the work, and there are many already pledged. January Spirit of Missions tells us that "Only once before, in a single calendar year, have so many recruits been added

to the staff of our distant missions. The Church is giving more largely of its best life." Theirs to sow the seed and wait for the glorious harvest. Theirs to lift the standard and sound the pibroch that will raise the mighty army, and our share is to furnish the "sinews of war."

Let us see that no woman is kept from the "firing line" by the lack of money.

And so we come back again to the beginning. Will you take the little blue boxes and the leaflets, and ask your friends and Churchwomen to express their thankfulness in this manner?

"THE WHOLE LINE STEPPED FORWARD"

N Eton boy stood in the aisle of the crowded parish church and listened to the Bishop of New Zealand. He wrote home that evening that the bishop had talked of going out to found a Church in the islands of the Pacific Ocean, and of meeting danger and difficulty there with trust in God. "Then, when he had finished. I think I never heard anything like the sensation, a kind of feeling that if it had not been on so sacred a spot, all would have exclaimed, 'God bless him.' "1

The boy was John Coleridge Patteson. He went back to the cricket field and lived the natural life of a boy at Eton. But in the background of his mind there was always the wish to go out with the Bishop of New Zealand, and work among the people of the islands. Twelve years afterward his purpose was carried out, and he left England, not to return again. It was as Missionary Bishop of Melanesia that he gave his life for the islanders whom he loved.

In Patteson's case, the call to missionary service was the natural result of his life at home and his training at school and college. He had given himself, all that he had and all that he was, to the One who wished to use him, and after that consecration of himself, the geographical location of his service was of secondary importance. He knew that all Christians should be missionaries, the sent ones of the King; "and not our fields, but our faithfulness matters."2 With a missionary vision and a missionary purpose dominating his life at home, he waited only for the definite word, which came to him, as it does to many people, through some one already on the field, to tell him where his place was

There would be less confusion in our minds about the terms "foreign missionary" and "missionary call," if we constantly realized that we are all under marching orders. Not only our King's command, but our own consciousness of privilege constitutes our responsibility. If we take our stand by Christ and try to "view the world of men from this high vantage ground,"s we cannot but share Christ's vision; and "he who shares Christ's vision, shares His work."3 Those of us who are already enlisted, through mission study classes, Auxiliary, Junior work, or any service in the Church at home, are as truly missionaries as those at the front, provided we have the Church's vision. "Though it is possible that anyone may be called to go, it is certain that all are called to see."3 If we have given our very selves and let the One who can fulfil all our need take possession of our lives, then the only point to be determined is the place where we are to serve. He will show us the corner of the field, whether at home or abroad, where we shall be of most use to Him, because we have not chosen Him, but He has chosen us. With a realization of His power to meet every human need, and of His expectation that all

people everywhere will at last be His, we have what constitutes the call from within.

And we know the call from the field to-day. It is sometimes the dumb appeal of those who are suffering. It is often voiced by those who are no longer living in darkness themselves, but who plead for their fellow-countrymen. It is always voiced by bishops and workers whom we have sent out to represent us. They tell us of particular positions waiting to be filled. Who is to be the nurse needed at once for that hospital? Who is to teach in that school from which girls have been turned away because there were not enough teachers for them all? Who is to work in that parish on the mission field, and do there what we are doing through classes, meetings and visiting here at home? The responsibility is ours, because we have been allowed to see and hear. "The suffering world speaks in a language that the sympathetic alone can understand, and then only after hard study. Where other people hear a cry of distress which says, 'I am in need,' strong compassion hears a voice which begs for aid: 'It is you who can best minister to me. Your wisdom and strength can succour me." We are strong, not in ourselves, but in Him who is ready to live out His Life through us.

It is obvious, however, that we cannot all be at the front. There are certain circumstances which are meant by Him to keep many of us out of the mission field. An age limit, set by those who know conditions; responsibility for some one dependent upon us at home; physical weakness, or lack of the training necessary for such special work, are all points any one of which, we may say with perfect honesty, would disqualify us for missionary service. It is often through such circumstances that He shows us His Will, and then, knowing it, we are glad to serve wherever He has placed us.

But we ourselves are not always the ones to judge of our own qualifications.

The time will come, if we are faithful, when many more Juniors will not only support the work from the home base, but will go out themselves in the vanguard. There are those now who would willingly go if they only knew that they were called. Many would gladly be like the Scots Guards that day at Windsor, when the colonel described the proposed Ashinta Expedition and its difficulties. He ended by saying, "I will turn my back for a moment. Any man who will volunteer to go on the expedition may step forward out of the line." He turned his back, and when he looked again, all were standing apparently as before. The colonel's eyes flashed with indignation, "What, the Scots Guards, and no volunteers!" A sergeant saluted. "Colonel." he said, "the whole line stepped forward."

A PICNIC MEETING

IN Western New York the Auxiliary officers of a certain district held a picnic meeting at the lakeshore home of one of their number. The day was occupied with discussion of Auxiliary matters, and was found to be both interesting and helpful, and from the little gathering came the contribution of \$5.25 toward general missions to help the Board in its time of summer need.

Any one of us, knowing the character of the work waiting to be done, would say at once, "I am not fitted to go." We may have heard the call from within, we may recognize the need and the call from the field, and yet hesitate to offer ourselves. There must be also the call from the Church through her authorized agency before we know that our place of service ought to be on some mission field. The question of our fitness must finally be determined by those who know what are the requirements. We may find out through waiting alone upon God whether or not our way seems to lead toward the place of greatest need and highest privilege. The next step is then to apply for appointment, and let others decide the

NOTES FROM AUXILIARY BRANCHES

Encouraging Words from Kansas City

AST October when discussing the matter of the apportionment assigned to the Kansas City branch, we found so few who really understood it that the President appointed me to visit every parish branch to give instruction upon this matter. I have just finished my visits and feel sure they have been of service. I found such a lack of knowledge. At each visit I explained the apportionment and said that the money for General Missions, or the designated sums which apply on our apportionment, should be paid first and promptly. I tried to discourage specials; but it is so hard to do this when these needs are so forcibly put. However, we are growing, though slowly. Our annual meeting last week was such a successthe best we have ever had, and I have missed only one meeting, either annual or quarterly, in the twenty years of our existence. We started a new scholarship. Two places were brought forward prominently-the Philippines and the work at Corbin, Ky. When asked if gifts for the latter would aid the Board, and it was thought not, the work in the Philippines was selected, but the plea for Corbin was so good that when the amount of pledges was counted there was enough for both.

Our Juniors took everything by storm. Two years ago last April our leader had never heard of a Junior Auxiliary, and we had never had a leader. She has never met anyone in charge of Junior work, but on Junior day the room was packed, even the window-sills were filled and the hall also, and then people went away. The Juniors have not given up one penny of their gift for General Missions, while struggling at the same time to secure a Mexican Scholarship, and beside that they have voted aid toward the Board's appropriations for educational work in Mexico. I think our Juniors are starting out right, and that they will not have to unlearn things. In them so

much of our hope lies.

The Woman's Auxiliary in a Western Missionary District

THE report from our branch of the Auxiliary evidences very little growth, but there is a decided growth in missionary interest throughout the district, though it will probably be some time yet before we show very much of a financial return. too, it seems almost an impossibility to get the women's guilds and Auxiliary branches to make proper reports. Quite a number of the guilds give something toward missions each year, and the bulk of the apportionment for the district is still paid by the various organizations of women, Every year we hope will be the last in which this is the case, but the progress is so slow toward the proper method of handling the district apportionment that the bishop and the rest of us get almost discouraged. The major portion of our missions live a hand-to-mouth existence and when a branch of the Woman's Auxiliary is suggested they immediately think it means an additional financial burden and consequently evidence little interest in it. During the past year our president was able to make one trip in the interest of the Auxiliary and started four branches. These branches are beginning to study some phases of the Church's work and are becoming interested, but it is rather slow. If it were possible for some officer of the Auxiliary to go out to visit all these missions, a branch to meet at least once a month might be organized in every one of them; but they should be followed up after their organization and kept interested until they have gotten far enough along for their own interest to keep them going properly. Nor should a branch be started at all without an understanding as to what the real purpose of the Auxiliary is. As things are, it might be possible to get some of these small places to give more, but it would be given mechanically and somewhat grudgingly, and not because they desired to give it.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF OFFERINGS

Offerings are asked to sustain missions in thirty missionary districts in the United States, Africa, China, Japan, Brazil, Mexico and Cuba; also work in the Haitien Church; in forty-two dioceses, including missions to the Indians and to the Colored People; to pay the salaries of thirty-two bishops, and stipends to 2,253 missionary workers, domestic and foreign; also two general missionaries to the Swedes and two missionaries among deaf-mutes in the Middle West and the South; and to support schools, hospitals and orphanages.

With all remittances the name of the Diocese and Parish should be given. Remittances, when practicable, should be by Check or Draft, and should always be made payable to the order of George Gordon King, Treasurer, and sent to him, Church Missions House, 281 Fourth Avenue, New York.

Remittances in Bank Notes are not safe unless sent in Registered Letters.

ST. PAUL'S COLLEGE, TOKYO, FUND

To June 1st, 1910

Last December, a committee was appointed in Philadelphia by the Foreign Committee of the Woman's Auxiliary (but without any official connection with the Woman's Auxiliary) for the purpose of raising funds to purchase land and erect buildings thereon, for St. Paul's College, Tokyo. This committee was composed of the following persons: Miss Fanny Brock, Miss Mary Blakiston, Mrs. A. J. Dallas Dixon, Miss Anne Hubbard, Mrs. John Markoe, Mrs. Charles R. Pancoast, Mrs. Walter E. Penrose, Mrs. Geo. Wharton Pepper, Miss Randolph, Mrs. W. W. Arnett, Miss Coles, and Mrs. Geo. F. Knorr, ex-officio. This committee was organized by electing Miss Coles, Chairman; Mrs. W. W. Arnett, Secretary, and Mr. S. F. Houston was asked to be treasurer of the committee.

In the following six months, this committee has succeeded in raising a sum which, added to the funds given to the Board of Missions for the same purpose (and in many instances so given through the efforts of this committee) is sufficient to pay for the land, fourteen acres, purchased on the outskirts of Tokyo by Bishop McKim for St. Paul's College. It is earnestly hoped that the members of the Protestant Episcopal Church will, at an early date, insure the usefulness of this purchase by donating a sufficient sum to erect the necessary buildings.

An inspection of the accompanying list of donors shows that those Dioceses which are not considered financially strong are, in many cases, better represented by contributions than some of the more wealthy dioceses. The Treasurer's statement is submitted herewith.
